Grace read us a humourous poem "Politic." Charlotte read the minutes from 30 years ago and it is very interesting to hear how we are still doing things the same.


Guest speaker Helen DuBois gave us a very interesting talk on ASSIC and health care reform changes that will soon be in effect. Ina and Charlotte thanked her.
