He added the Town will put money into sprucing up the Community Centre, including fixing the washrooms to make them wheelchair accessible and constructing a kitchenette.

The Seniors will use a \$30,000 operating grant they received from the province in early August to pay their recently hired co-

ordinator, hydro, water, rent and other costs, while \$7,000 of their \$21,000 Horizons grant has already gone toward purchasing new furniture.

Neil Miller, a five-year member of the Seniors Centre Committee, said the Community Centre will be ideal for seniors to skate in the winter and play badminton during the spring. And being on

the Prospect Park grounds, they can walk around the track.

"We'll have to juggle ourselves with the other users of the arena, but it should work out since we'll be using it during the day fivedays-a-week," Miller said.

"We'll likely get a spot in the new arena, but I don't want to hold my breath (on the start date of its construction)."

#### Chain saw theft on Churchill

### Need info on Acton crime

Police believe someone with electrical knowledge was probably involved in a theft in Acton early this month, and investigators hope the public can help identify whoever is responsible.

Sometime between Oct. 7 and 11, 1,600 feet of inch-thick copper wire was stolen from the old Beardmore Tannery on Elgin Street.


Electricity was passing through the lines (suspended from roof supports) at the time of the theft.

The weight of the stolen material was estimated to be in the area of half a ton, and was worth between \$2,000 and \$5,000.




