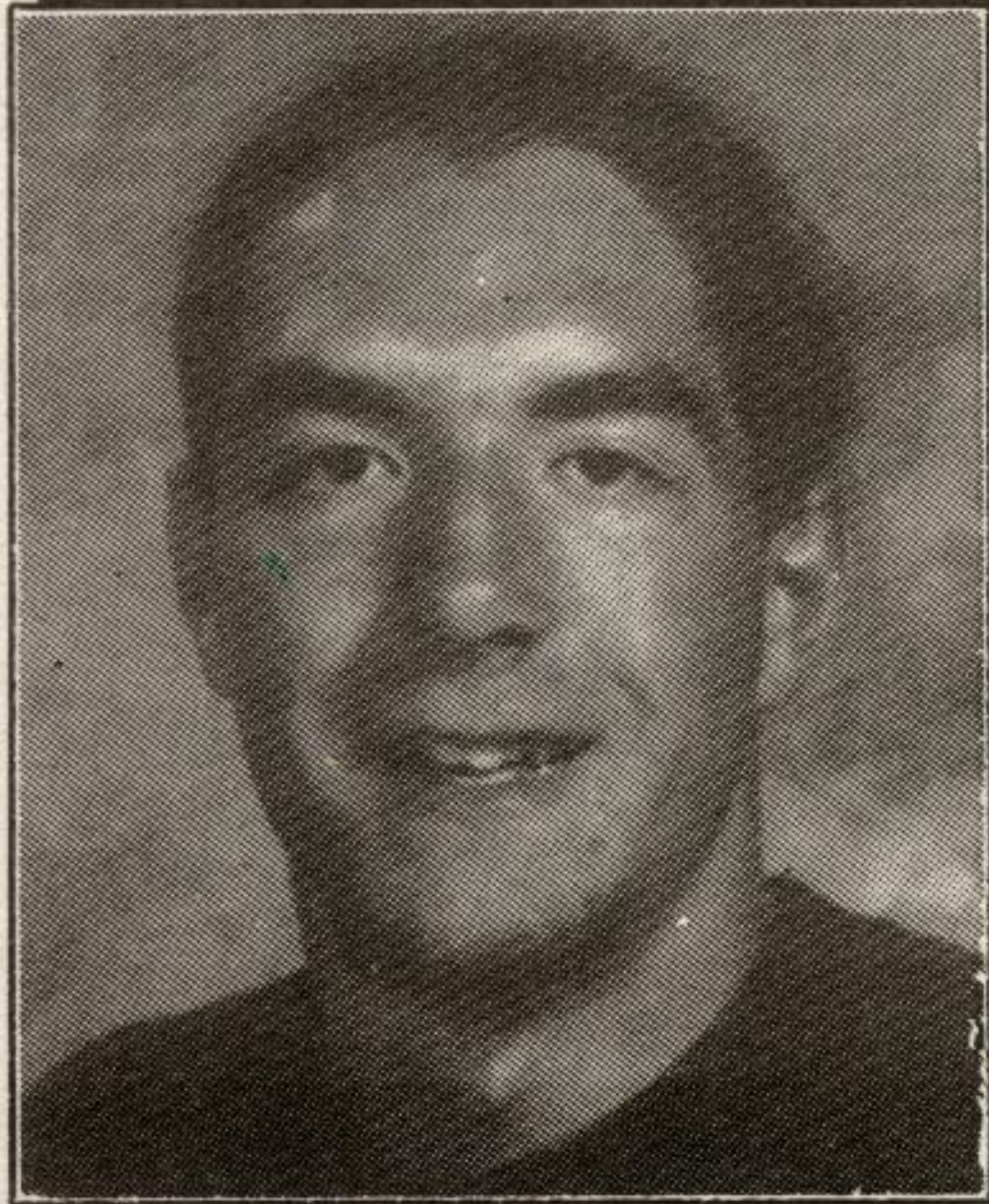


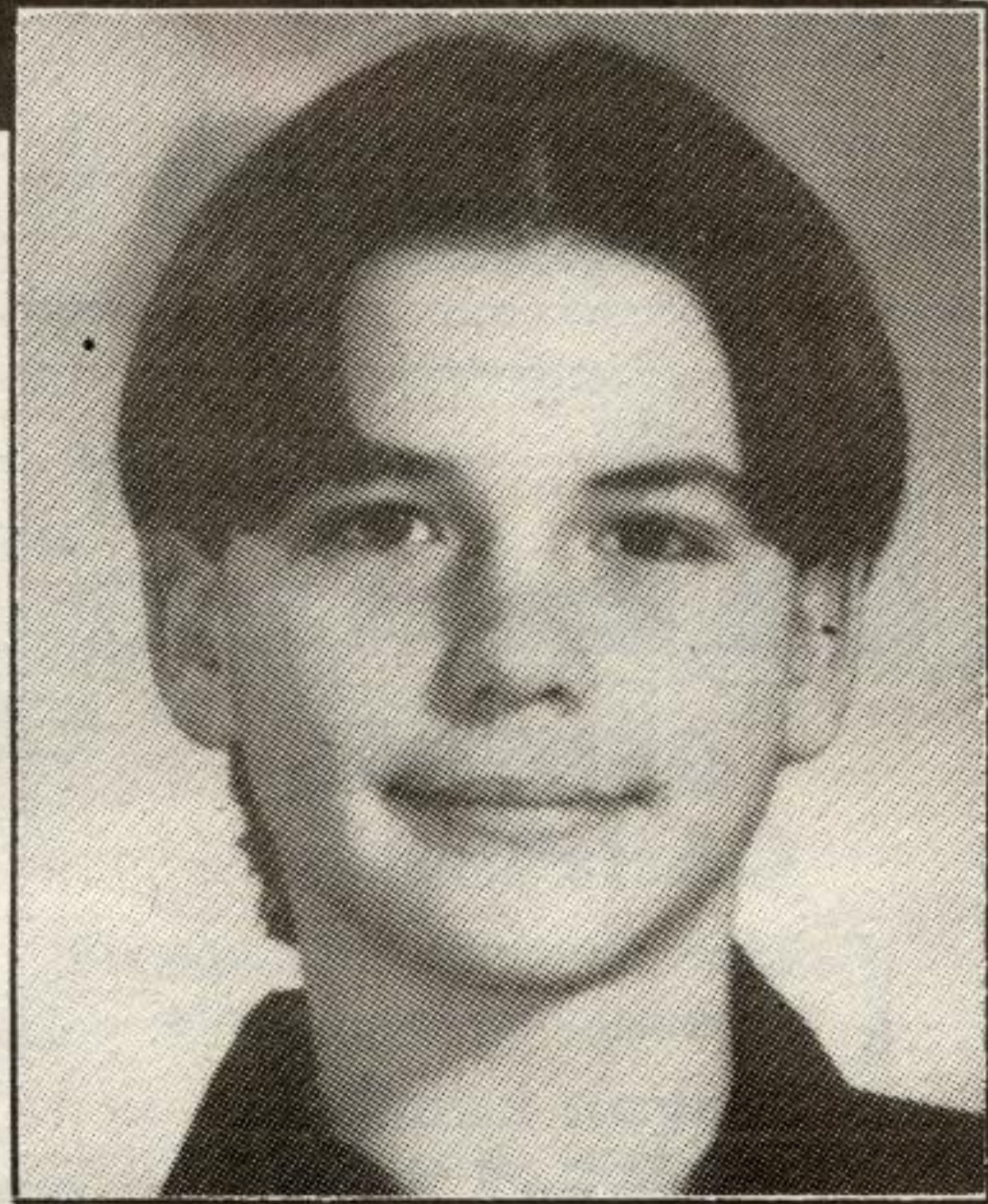
HOCKEY REPORT
