'Positive progress' reported in Acton growth studies

There is an air of cautious optimism following last week's Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) prehearing concerning Acton growth.

The OMB recognized there had been "positive progress" in various studies relating to water, and laid out a timetable that could, in the best-case scenario, see some development approved in Acton this spring.

Residential and commercial development has been stalled, mainly by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, while complicated tests and studies are done to assess the potential impact of development on Black Creek and Fairy Lake.

Plans now on the books would see Acton grow to 10,000 people.

"The light at the end of the tunnel is that much closer — we hope," said Town planning director Bruce McLean on Friday.

"The OMB showed some optimism by saying there had been positive progress on the issues. The caveat to that is that we are still a long way to having all the I's dotted and the T's crossed."

McLean said the key now rests with the agencies—the conservation authorities, the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, the Ministry of Energy and Environment and various levels of government—who must comment on the Water Implementation Plan and on subdivision and zoning changes, before the end of the year.

"Also, Halton Region has to resolve its responsibilities relative to necessary servicing improvements and financing."

In February the OMB will hold a pre-hearing to learn whether the servicing issues have been settled.

Between February and March, Town and Regional Councils will deal with staff reports on the development issues.



"Halton Council will deal with implementation of the servicing reports, where the money will come from and the timetable for implementation," McLean said.

"At the same time, the Town, armed with the results of the Jan. 31 Water Management Study, will be able to move on the plans of subdivision and zoning that have been submitted. By then we will know the maximum growth that can occur in Acton."

In early March the OMB will reconvene and the first part of the hearing will update final positions.

"Hypothetically, by March everybody could be in agreement and the OMB could be in a position to give OKs to everything. If there are problems, the OMB has set aside three weeks in April to try to resolve those issues.

"If all the pre-conditions have been satisfied then the OMB would be in a position to say that the planning is OK and the subdivisions and zonings are OK and tell the developers to start building," McLean said.

There are a number of critical dates in the timetable laid out by the OMB:

Friday, Dec. 23 — Deadline for comments from all affected agencies on the Town's new and revised plans of subdivision.

Tuesday, Jan. 31 — Acceptance of the final Water Implementation Plan by all affected agencies and levels of government.

Monday, Feb. 6 — OMB prehearing update on results of comments on the Water Implementation Plan.

March 8, 9, 10 — OMB hearing to deal with a further updates, motions and rulings.

Tuesday, April 25 — If there are problems with the reports and studies the OMB will reconvene a full hearing to deal with the issues.


