

Operation Identification is a program designed to discourage theft of valuables from your home and other locations and provide a way to identify stolen property.

The program has dramatically reduced the profit in stolen goods. Marked articles are difficult to dispose of and easily traced. Thus, if it is advertised that your valuables are protected by Operation Identification, you will less likely be victimized.

Operation Identification works whether your property is stolen or lost. Proper identification makes it easier for police to return personal property.


