## Township snowplows, sanders ready for coming snowfalls

While Len Smeltzer isn't waiting for that first dump of snow with bated breath, he knows his men are ready when it happens.

The superintendent of public works for Eramosa Township said recently that three sander-plow trucks have gone through the necessary pre-winter check-up and are ready to tackle the wintry conditions.

"Certification of the trucks and

maintenance started about a month ago. We have our own operating mechanic on staff. I'm not hoping for the snow, because we have lots to keep us busy," said Smeltzer, adding the department has been involved with Union Gas and their installment of natural gas into the village.

They're also working on rural addressing, putting number signs in front of country properties.

Smeltzer, who operates a plow himself, said the Township will use a mixture of salt and sand to keep area roads safe.

"When it gets extra icy we'll add more salt. It grips the road a lot more and isn't as harsh on them as sand," he said.

A long period of cold temperatures coupled with a lot of ice demanded a lot of sand on the roads last January and February, Smeltzer stated.

He said he doesn't know what to expect for this year.

"If you went by the Farmer's Almanac we would have freezing rain by now. It's hard to say what will happen this year. The weather's unpredictable."

He said the Township will hire a contract worker or two for the winter months, along with having a few on-call workers directly in a town such as Rockwood.

He mentioned one employee will be assigned to keep the old Town Hall, the medical centre, fire hall and sidewalks sanded.

Smeltzer said five operators – four truck-plow workers and one grader—will cover an area as far as the Hwy. 7-Puslinch-Guelph boundary to 15 kilometres north of Hwy. 24, along with Rockwood, Eden Mills and Everton.


