

Pliotas rules the pool at Burlington meet

In her first meet as a Senior girls swimmer (15-and-over), Acton Aqua Duck Julie Pliotas narrowly missed the club's 100-metre Breaststroke record of 1:24.36 set in 1989 with a fifth-place swim of 1:24.76 at Centennial Pool in Burlington on Saturday.

However, she returned on Sunday to break the 1989 Senior record of 3:02.93 in the 200m Breaststroke with a 3:02.68 effort.

Other local results included Gareth Lichty breaking a 1990 Aqua Ducks record in the 200m Freestyle. He also shattered

records for the 50m Freestyle and 200m Individual Medley, grabbing silver medals in the process.

Kara MacDonald, competing in the 15-and-over girls bracket took a fourth in the 50m Freestyle and added her name to the record books.

She later placed sixth in both the 100m and 200m Backstroke.

Establishing personal best swims were Mike Lenizky, Jaime MacDonald, Sylvia Bragg-Smith, Laura Tummings, Steven Potterton, Michelle Addley and Stephen McKeon-Foley.
