

Play a little 'Jingle' for yourself this Christmas

If "it's the thought that counts" when giving a gift, then think about this — you really could make someone feel like a million bucks with lottery tickets from the Ontario Lottery Corporation (OLC) this holiday season. Festive lottery games are guaranteed to be fun, the right size, the right colour, at a price to fit your budget.

Now that you've decided OLC holiday games are the perfect stocking stuffer, there's only one more thing to think about. Would you share a big prize from a lottery ticket given to you as a gift over the holiday season?

winners share their winnings with friends and family — another good reason to give lottery tickets as gifts this holiday season.
