Arena's proshop saved

A last-minute compromise means the M & M Sports Pro Shop and skate-sharpening facility will not have to move out of the Acton arena.

On Monday night, officials with the Town, Minor Hockey Association, House League Hockey Association, Acton seniors and the three Acton councillors reached a deal to relocate the pro shop at the arena, instead of closing it on Jan. 1 as scheduled.

The move to the arena by Acton seniors, who will open a seniors centre there in the new year, meant that the pro shop and skate-sharpening service would have to go.

That prospect caused concern among the hockey groups in Acton along with players' parents, who were unhappy with the prospect of using the automatic skate-sharpening machine at the arena.

Town staff had said it would not make economic sense to relocate the pro shop because this season may be the last in the aging arena, as plans proceed for a new arena in Acton east.

The compromise deal will allow the pro shop to relocate at its former location, just inside the arena's front doors. Acton Minor Hockey will purchase a steel security door, since entry to the proshop will now be through the Town's concession booth.

Work on relocating the proshop will begin in early January, in conjunction with the \$20,000 in renovations necessary to prepare the arena for the new seniors centre.
