That's how Santa Claus will make his last trip to Rockwood before Saturday when he joins 14 other floats in the village's second annual Parade of Lights tomorrow (Thursday) night at 8 pm.

The 90-minute agricultural-Santa Claus parade will begin just north of Rockmosa Park, head into town and west on Hwy. 7 to Guelph Street. It then heads back toward

Organizers are hoping people jam the streets to see lights dangling from the area's top farm equipment.

The idea came about six years ago when 11 members of the Third and Fourth Line March Blahs group of Eramosa Township were joking about attaching lights to farm equipment and parading.

> "When it (the machine) comes down the street it doesn't even need lights on it," says Swanston, who adds the parade will also include carollers from Burlington, horses and Christmas music from Rockwood TV.

"There will also be a few surprises," Swanston continued, "including a float no one has seen here that rivals one south of the border."

And what's a parade without sipping on a hot cup of cider, especially if Jack Frost is nipping at your nose. The Rockwood Information Centre will be handing out cider to its visitors and more will be available at another stop along the parade route.


And for those with camcorders, flood lights will be set up in front of McPhed's to make lighting ideal for taping.
