Interested citizens are invited to apply for positions on various boards and committees.

INTERESTED?

- all positions are for a term to expire in Dec. 1997
- unless otherwise specified, all positions are volunteer
- meetings generally occur in the evenings

THE COMMITTEES?

ACTIVAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- five (5) members needed
- meets a maximum of six (6) times per year
- to act as an advisory body to set policy for the Town's Activan service which is a public transit service for our physically disabled residents

COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT

- five (5) members needed
- meets once or twice per month
- remuneration of \$40 per meeting
- to act as a decision-making body which considers applications for minor variances to the Town's Zoning By-law and other planning matters

HERITAGE HALTON HILLS

- six (6) members are needed to join with three (3) continuing members
- regular monthly meetings
- to act as an advisory body respecting the designation of buildings of historical and architectural interest under the Ontario Heritage Act

HALTON HILLS LIBRARY BOARD

- four (4) members needed
- must be 18 years, Canadian citizen and resident of Halton Hills
- must not be municipal or library employee
- regular monthly meeting plus special meetings
- to act as a decision-making body to set policy for the management, regulation and control of the Library

PROPERTY STANDARDS COMMITTEE

- three (3) members needed
- should be a resident of Halton Hills
- should not be a municipal employee
- meets on an as-needed basis
- to act as a decision-making body to hear appeals of property owners from Orders to Comply issued by Property Standards Officers

TOWN ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

- eleven (11) members are needed
- to be composed of both individuals who have a professional interest in the field of environmental management and of individuals who have a personal interest in environmental protection
- regular monthly meetings and sub-committee meetings as needed
- to act as an advisory body seeking ways to protect, maintain and enhance the Town's natural environment
