
New micro-filtered milk gains acceptance in Acton

It tastes fresher longer. It's smoother. It's creamier.

These are just some of the comments being bandied about concerning Ault Foods Ltd.'s launching, last month, of Lactantia PurFiltre Milk. This new product claims to be a purer, fresher tasting milk that stays fresh longer, according to one of Canada's largest milk processors.

After six weeks of having rival American-owned Beatrice Foods Ltd. seek an injunction — denied by a judge on Jan. 6 — Ault continues to promote what they say is "the first significant improvement in milk technology since Louis Pasteur invented pasteurization over 100 years ago."

Among other claims, Beatrice insisted that Ault's ads suggested that Lactantia is more nutritious than other milk.

Beatrice is requesting to meet with the Canadian National Dairy Council to raise further objections

against their rival.

But despite continued controversy, Lactantia seems to have intrigued local consumers and is selling at a moderate rate at both Acton IGA and Acton Foodland. However, Steve Liebig at Knechtel's in Rockwood says his store won't carry Lactantia, because they don't deal with Ault Foods.

"To be honest," reports IGA dairy-frozen product manager Charlie Auger, "it's not selling at a high rate, but each week it picks up a bit more."

Lactantia PurFiltre Milk reportedly has a shelf life of 30 days compared to the standard 18 -

and contains 92 times less bacteria than milk that has only been pasteurized.

"The big thing is the shelf date," continues Auger, adding IGA began stocking the new product on its shelves on Jan. 13.

According to a press release. Beatrice's four-litre price of \$2.99. dated Jan. 19, the PurFiltre process is based on new proprietary technology developed over sev-

eral years at an investment of \$8 million.

By passing milk through an extremely fine filter, impurities in milk are removed prior to pasteurization — while all nutrients, such as protein, calcium and vitamins — remain.

The nutrients are not affected because nutrient molecules are much smaller than bacteria and flow through the filtering procedure untouched.

Two consumers at IGA on Thursday said they would try the milk and likely stick with it, based on its longer shelf life and the 92 times less bacteria.

"I didn't notice a difference, but my husband noticed it tasted creamier. He said it does taste fresher, but it's almost too sweet for milk," said Acton's Sandi Carwardine, who decided to fork over the extra 40 cents above

Added local resident Diana Gunn: "I'll give it a try; I'm curious more than anything."


