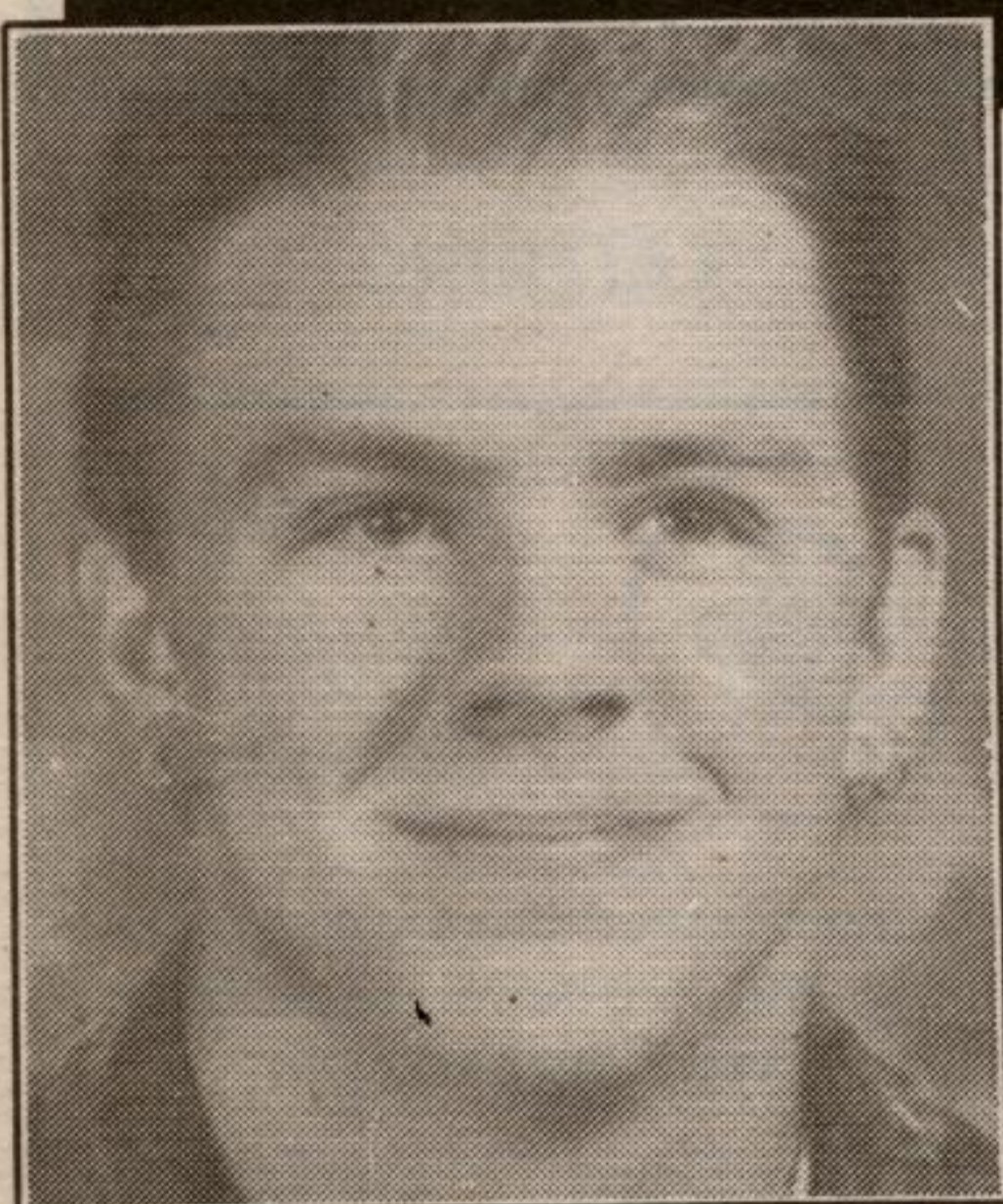


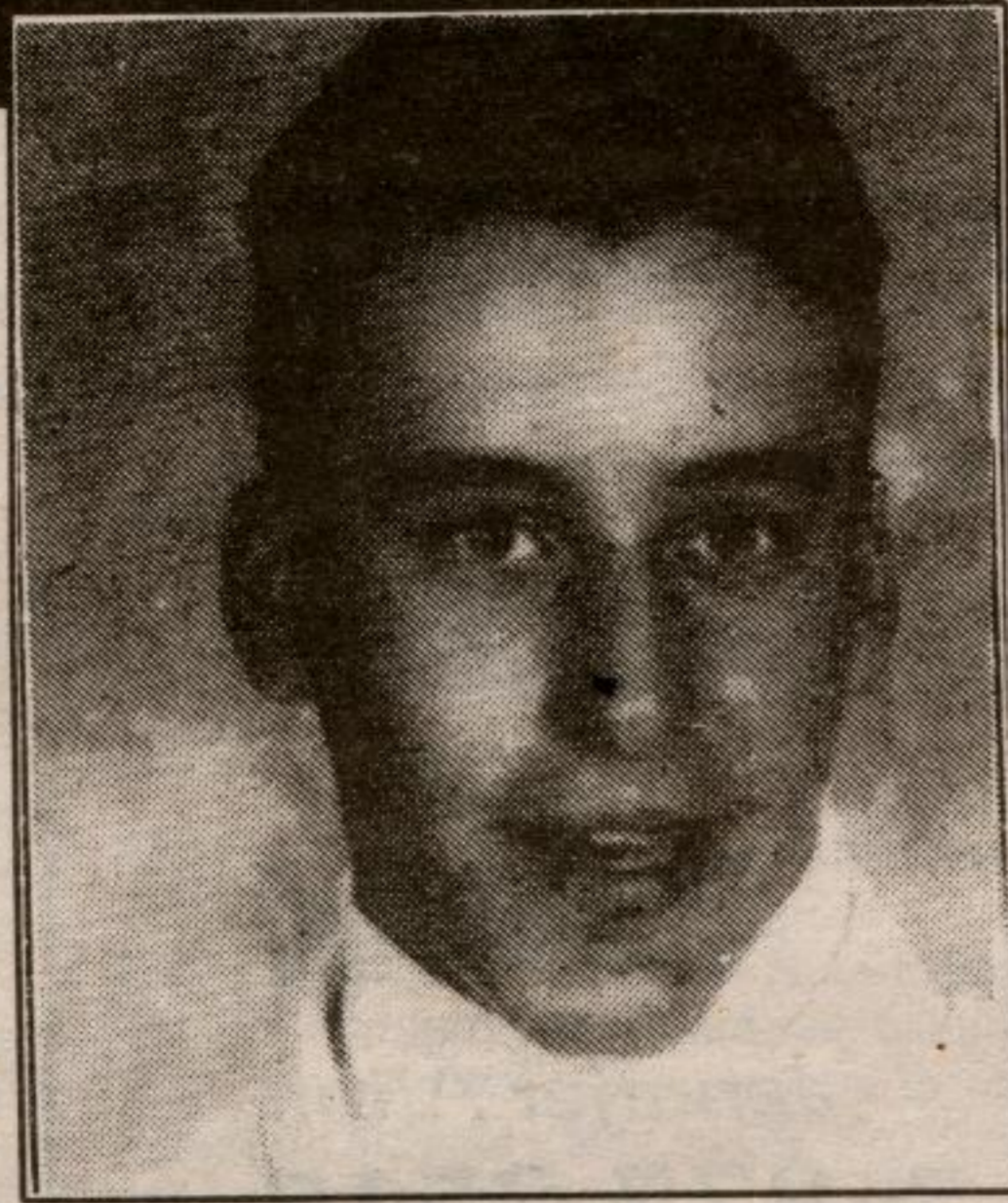
# HOCKEY REPORT

### PEEWEE 1

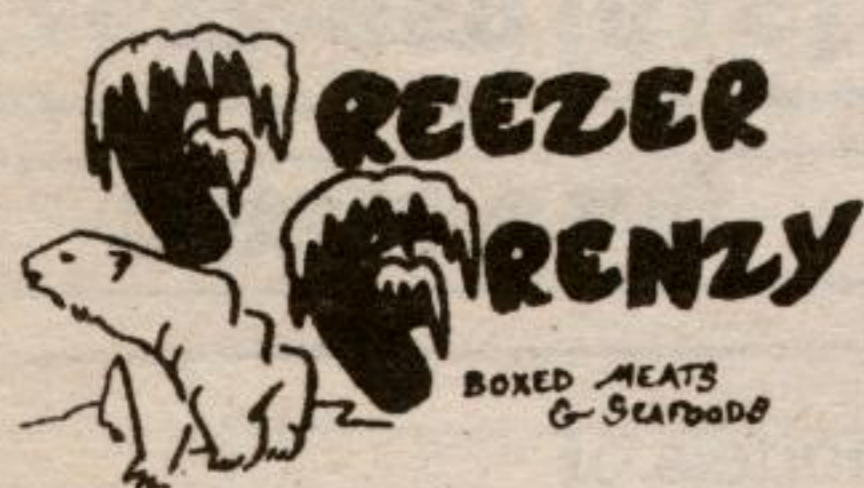
