Hadfield joins French cycling team Riomois for 4 months

After travelling 3,000 kilometres that included 20km climbs of 3,000 to 4,000 feet and six-hour, 200km riding days, Tim Hadfield is ready for the next step.

Into a bed? Hardly. Try four months racing with Riomois, a national team in France.

After returning last week from a month-long training session in Tucson, Arizona, where he built up leg strength with intense riding, the Acton cyclist headed to Riom, France on Monday.

Hadfield says his training was ideal for the numerous 160km to 200km races he'll face when competing for unranked Riomois.

"It (racing for Riomois) might

be better for me," said Hadfield last week. Originally, the 23-yearold was to be a member of VC, one of the country's top-ranked clubs. Hadfield, though, says he fully trusts Canadian national team coach Denis Roux, "to set me up well with a team."

Roux, by the way, asked the talented Hadfield to join a French team last year, but the latter felt he had some unfinished business here.

"There were a lot of races in North America that I still wanted to compete in," said Hadfield, who finished 17th in a 10-mile scratch Canadian team that faced Australia in the semifinal of a 4,000metre team pursuit race at the Commonwealth Games in August. "I'm

ready now to make the four-month commitment... there's no program like this in North America."

Hadfield, however, isn't setting his goals too high. He would like nothing more than to stay healthy, to do well in numerous races and "learn a little French."

"I'm not peaking right now, but I don't want to be. The athletes in France are a little more aggressive racing-wise, but I know what it takes," he said confidently.

"They're all trying their best whereas some cyclists here (North America) sometimes don't know race and was part of the four-man if they want to race. In France, they treat it like a job and have a goal to turn professional, while people here do it for fun and have no aspirations."


