Flour mill plans anger neighbours

Some neighbours of Halton Flour Milling claim the Mill Street East business's extension plans will destroy their community.

A petition with over 50 names from angry neighbours was tabled

at Town Council on Monday night.

The residents want Council to reject the mill's plans to annex a nearby house and re-zone its use to industrial, add three new silos and add a weigh scale.

The neighbours claim the already "invasive" mill operations would become intolerable if a weigh scale is allowed because it would increase truck noise and gasoline fumes around-the-clock.

Seniors' centre should be ready by March 31

Construction of the "interim" seniors' centre at the Acton Community Centre, should be complete by March 31 with programming commencing on April 17.

This is what seniors aged 55-and-over will be told at the Legion on March 8 at 7:30 pm during a general information meeting to discuss the developments and progress of the \$34,000 renovation project.

The new centre will be approximately 80-feet by 30-feet on the arena's upper level.

"The Community Centre is kind of a dingy-looking place that is not at all inviting, but the seniors' centre won't look like that at all," assured seniors' centre committee chair Gerald Rennie on Friday.

The 20-member Acton Seniors'

Committee will put \$20,000 toward the renovation (replacing cracked walls, flooring and kitchen area, etc.) with the Town and province covering the balance.

The seniors have raised \$42,000 through fund-raising projects. They also have \$35,000 from the annual operating grant from the province and have spent over one-third of the \$20,000 New Horizons grant for furnishings.

Some of the grant has been used to hire new co-ordinator, Adrianna Lawless. The grant will also be used for hydro, water and rent.

"I hope the people come out," Rennie said. "It's important that the seniors meet the co-ordinator, so we can recognize things they can do and that they're connected with us."
