they are 100 years old. Students also went skating last week, and have just started a games club.


Grade 2-3 classes have finished learning about simple machines. They are now in the planning stages of castle construction, which will include some of the simple machines they have just studied.


From your Village Constable...

Please place these important numbers by your telephone.

9-1-1: is to be used for emergency, life threatening situations which require emergency response from POLICE, FIRE, AM-BULANCE. Also, for use when a SERIOUS CRIMINAL OF-FENCE IS IN PROGRESS.

853-2111: is to be used for calls for service which require a response within a short period of time, or for those calls which do require immediate attention.


853-2050: is to be used to reach the village constable, for low priority calls (service call) i.e. wilful damage, fraud cheque, thefts not in process, etc. Also, this phone number should be used for questions and concerns about your community. Please note, the village constable's phone is sometimes answered by an answering machine. By leaving a message for the village constable, your problem can be responded to by an officer who works in your community on a continual basis. He will return your call, and an






