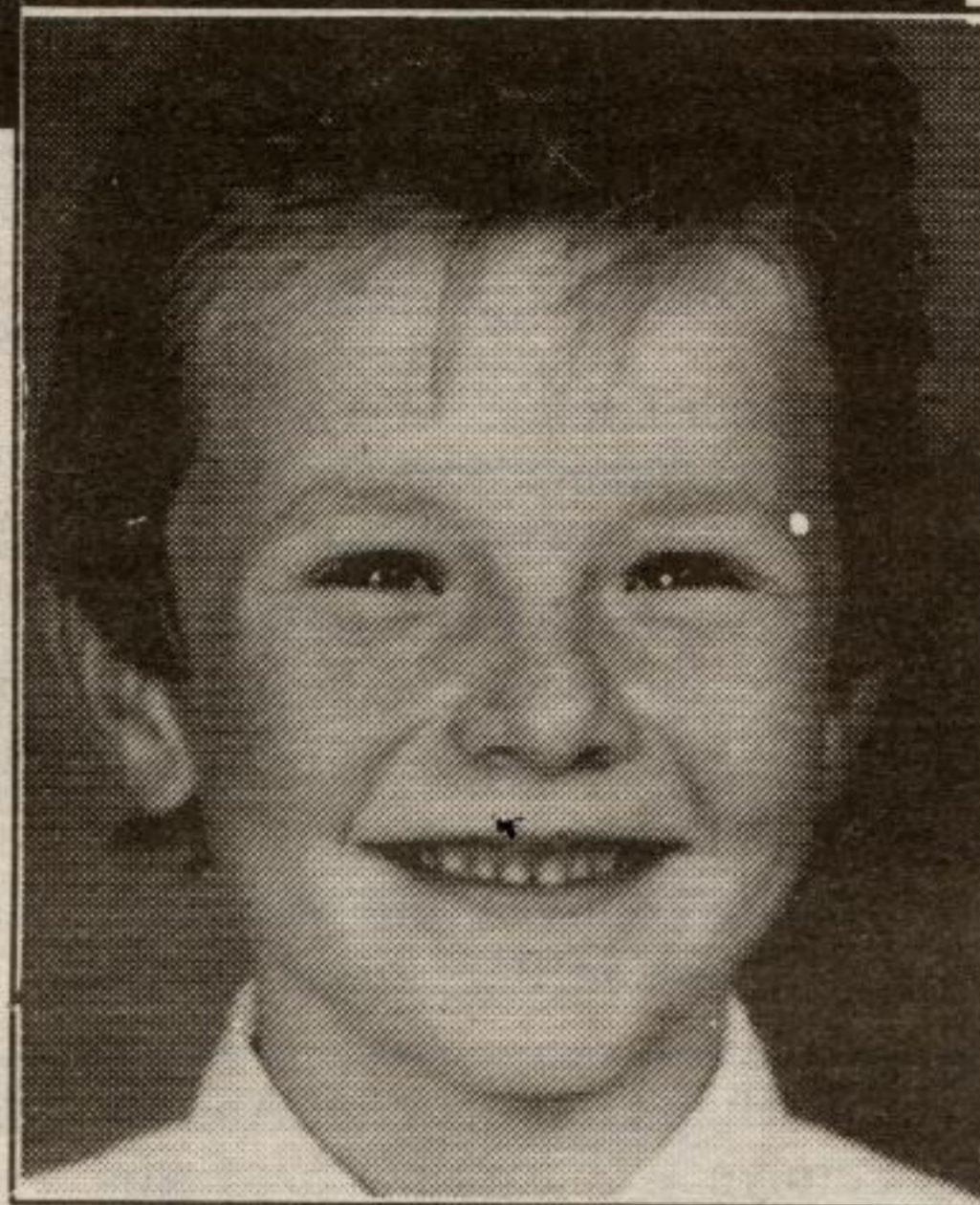


PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



MATT WOLFER

A forward with the Acton Proplastex Atom 2 Sabres, Matt has been named Player of the Week after notching an important goal to give his team a 2-1 lead in an eventual 5-3 victory over Arthur last Tuesday. The win vaulted the locals to Round 2 of the OMHA playoffs.
