

Well, the NHL lockout hurt a lot of people, and even though you might not believe it, some of the players were really hurt by it.





Golfers ... DID YOU KNOW? with Len Dodds



GRIPS, PART II: As stated in Part I, the grip provides you with your only physical contact with the golf club. Therefore, it is important you have the proper grip size. Properly-sized grips give the golfer a comfortable feeling at address, positive control during the swing and do not inhibit wrist action. If the club (grip) doesn't feel right in your hand, then it obviously won't feel good as you make a swing.

The standard rule in selecting grip size is that when the anchor hand is on the grip (left hand for right-handed players and right for lefties) the ring and middle fingers should be no more than 1/16th of an inch away from the base of your hand. If they are further away, the grip is too large. If your fingernails are digging into your palm, the grip is too small.

Many golfers are not aware that grips can be installed in different sizes and that different variations of grip sizes are possible under the left vs. the right hand.

When you next have your clubs regripped, take time to evaluate grip size.


