Tyler's neighbours to be warned

From Front Page plaints from future neighbours. The Board ruled that potential

homeowners must be warned, in any purchase agreement, that the bus operation exists. There must

also be at least 100 feet between Tyler's land and future homes.

The Board did not deal with Tyler's appeal concerning his four acre parcel of land on the west side of Hwy. 25 at Scene Street.

Tyler objects to the Town rezoning this land to allow only dry industrial uses. He wants to hook into the municipal water and sewer system.

Town Council will deal with the Tyler by-law on March 27. In addition, the Board has set aside two days at the end of April for a hearing on the issue.





Assault at minor hockey game

A 10-year-old Wynford Place girl was allegedly beat up in the stands at a minor hockey game at the Acton Arena on Saturday evening.

The altercation took place during a playoff contest between Acton's Peewee 1 Sabres and a visiting team from Six Nations. The Acton girl apparently was grabbed by the back of her head and punched numerous times during a series of heated exchanges among parents and family members of players.

Police arrived after the suspect fled (she was possibly observed leaving the arena parking lot in a white Ford Thunderbird).

Halton Police are looking for a female with long black hair, who is in her teens. She is approximately 5'6" tall and 145 lbs. She was wearing a Georgetown Hoya bomber-style jacket.

Police ask for assistance

Police are asking for help in locating a suspicious man who has been bothering residents at the Maria and Mill Street apartment buildings in downtown Acton.

On Friday afternoon a female Maria Street resident received a call on her intercom from a man claiming to have a parcel for her at the front door. When she went to the building's lobby the man had gone.

The suspect is described as white, thin, with short blond hair. He wore eyeglasses and carried a blue duffle bag.
