Fashion show at Rockmosa April 10

With winter seemingly behind us, Pat Newlands wanted to organize an event to get seniors out with other members of the community, and to inform the public that the Eramosa Seniors' Resource Centre provides a service as well.

She thought of gourmet cooking, but thought something a little more frivolous was in order, since the centre has exhausted preventative works on nutrition.

So on April 10, men and women will be modeling clothing from Whitby's *Prime Time Fashions* in the centre's first Spring Fashion Show set for Rockmosa at 7 pm.

"People are sick and tired of winter clothes and want to get out," insists Newlands, a clerical assistant with the East Wellington Advisory Group (EWAG). "We would like to see older people get out and mix with the rest of the community."

While many don't have family nearby, Newlands says that seniors branching out into the community will create an extended family with benefits for all.

The Rockwood seniors' centre, which has been in town for two years, is an outreach program of EWAG, a multi-service centre which delivers a wide-range of helpful programs and social services (volunteer transportation, care and shopping) to people in East Wellington County.

"There's so much more we could do," explains Newlands, "but it all takes money."

EWAG is an incorporated, non-profit, charitable organization that is run by a 16-member volunteer board of directors.

Newlands felt a change from the regular eye sight, hearing and preventative clinics would give the local seniors' centre better exposure and let people know they have a used book store at 126 Main Street.

The models, from Erin and Rockwood, including local residents Ray and Betty Death, will model clothing from sizes 2 to 44.

"Who wears a size 2?" Newlands, a Mount Forest resident, questions. "I'd like to see someone wear a size 2. There would be nothing left (of them)."
