Church break-ins

Police are looking for vandals broke into two Acton churches over the weekend.

Sometime between Friday and Sunday thieves forced open a basement window at Churchill Community Church and stole a stereo amplifier (valued at \$300) and a box of food. The food was later recovered a short distance away from the Third Line church.

Between Saturday and Sunday the Acton Baptist Church was entered through a basement window. The culprits entered the Mill Street building and turned on the lights, but police say there was nothing stolen. Damage to the broken window is estimated at \$50.

Assault charges laid

A 27-year-old Mill Street East man has been charged with assault after police were contacted by the Children's Aid Society last week.

The man allegedly struck a child living at the same residence last Tuesday at approximately 7:30 am. The youth was reportedly hit in the face.

Police say the accused appeared in Milton court for a bail hearing on Monday.

Beardmore blaze

Acton volunteer fire fighters were called to a fire on the grounds of the old Beardmore tannery on Friday evening just after 9 pm.

The blaze was restricted to the old pumping station and there was no serious damage, according to the Halton Hills Fire Department.

A fire department employee said Monday that vandals likely set the blaze.

Attempted break-in

A would-be thief attempted to pry open a patio door at a Danville Avenue home sometime between March 31 and April 9, according to police.

The homeowner noticed signs of the attempted break-in and notified police.
