Organizer Mike Maas expects to see a lot of old electric furnaces.


"Now that Union Gas has come to the village, I bet we'll see a lot of old hot water heaters and old electric equipment.

## Candidates hit campaign trail

Wellington Family Coalition Party (FCP) candidate Dr. John Neenan intends to cut back on government spending if he's elected over incumbent MPP Ted Arnott in the June 8 provincial election.

The 30-year family practitioner, who resides in Kitchener, says education and economy are the province's main issues.

"The economy is biting into everybody's problems, because we all know we're up against it," says Dr. Neenan, a member of the Canadian Physicians for Life group, who ran for the FCP in 1987 and '90. "There's no restriction in government spending and the debt is increasing exponentially. If we don't do something, it will be inherited by our children.

"We feel people are not able to control how children are educated, so we will find schools which will be delegated by the Ministry to people who want their own form of education."

Neenan, a father of four, has his office at 751 Victoria St. S. in Kitchener. The phone number is (519) 743-1041.

Arnott, meanwhile, looks to build upon the 1990 election, in which he grabbed 109 of the 191 total polls (57 per cent).

At 32, he's the youngest member of the current P.C. caucus at Queen's Park. He also serves as
