library to move so the seniors could have that building," Shepard explained.

"I'm sure we will suggest that the seniors come to Acton East and I don't think staff would support the seniors moving into the library building."

The Library Board is currently doing a future needs study but it will not be completed before Town Council must decide what will be in the new complex, to be built on the north side of Hwy. 7, just east of Churchill Road.

Councillors were told to expect

a full report on all issues and options by late June or early July.

The 21-month design and construction timetable would see the facility open in the fall of 1997.

One of the major issues still to be resolved is the servicing arrangement with the three residential developers in Acton East.

Staff hope they will all be ready to build when the Town is ready to start on the arena complex so they can share the cost of the water and sewer services.

Acton Councillor Gerald Rennie has some concerns about the timing of the servicing.

"I'm concerned that the three developers could hold us up with the Master Servicing Plan, since we have to dove-tail with them. I hope that they don't constipate the

whole process," Rennie said.

Councillor Norm Elliott said he was only partially satisfied with the information from the meeting.

"I'm glad that things are coming together, but I'm frustrated that it's taken so long."

Elliott predicted that the seniors would be a part of the new facility, but the library would not because there is no political will to expand Acton's library.

"We've got to be realistic about how much we can spend in Acton."

"We just built a \$1 million fire hall and now we're getting a \$4 million community centre."

Councillor Rick Bonnette said he was glad that the meeting clearly laid out all of the issues and he's pleased that there seems to be a workable timetable.

Summer Activity Centres provide a safe environment for children, with enthusiastic leaders, weekly themes, special events, daily swims and weekly off-site bus trips.

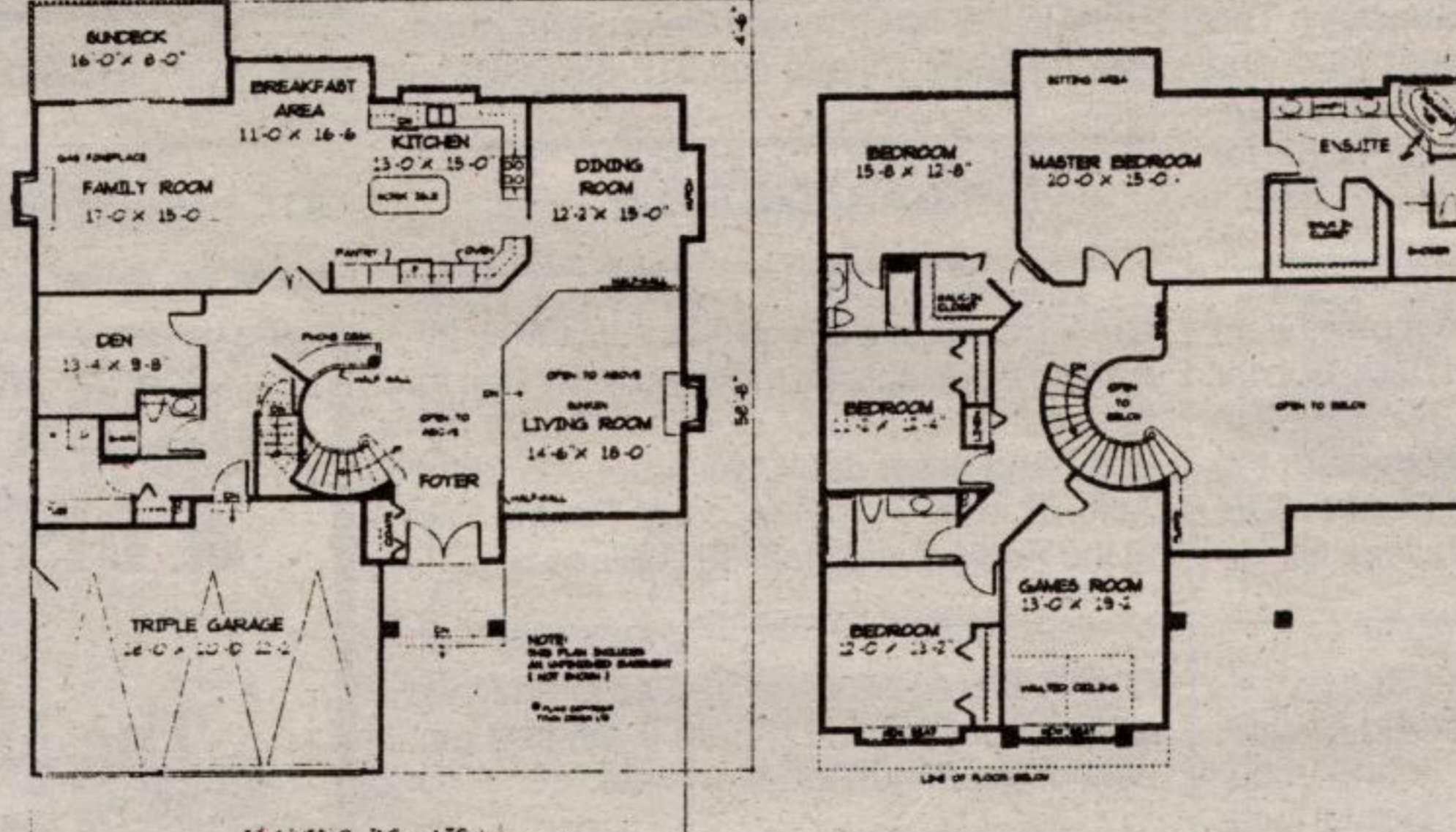
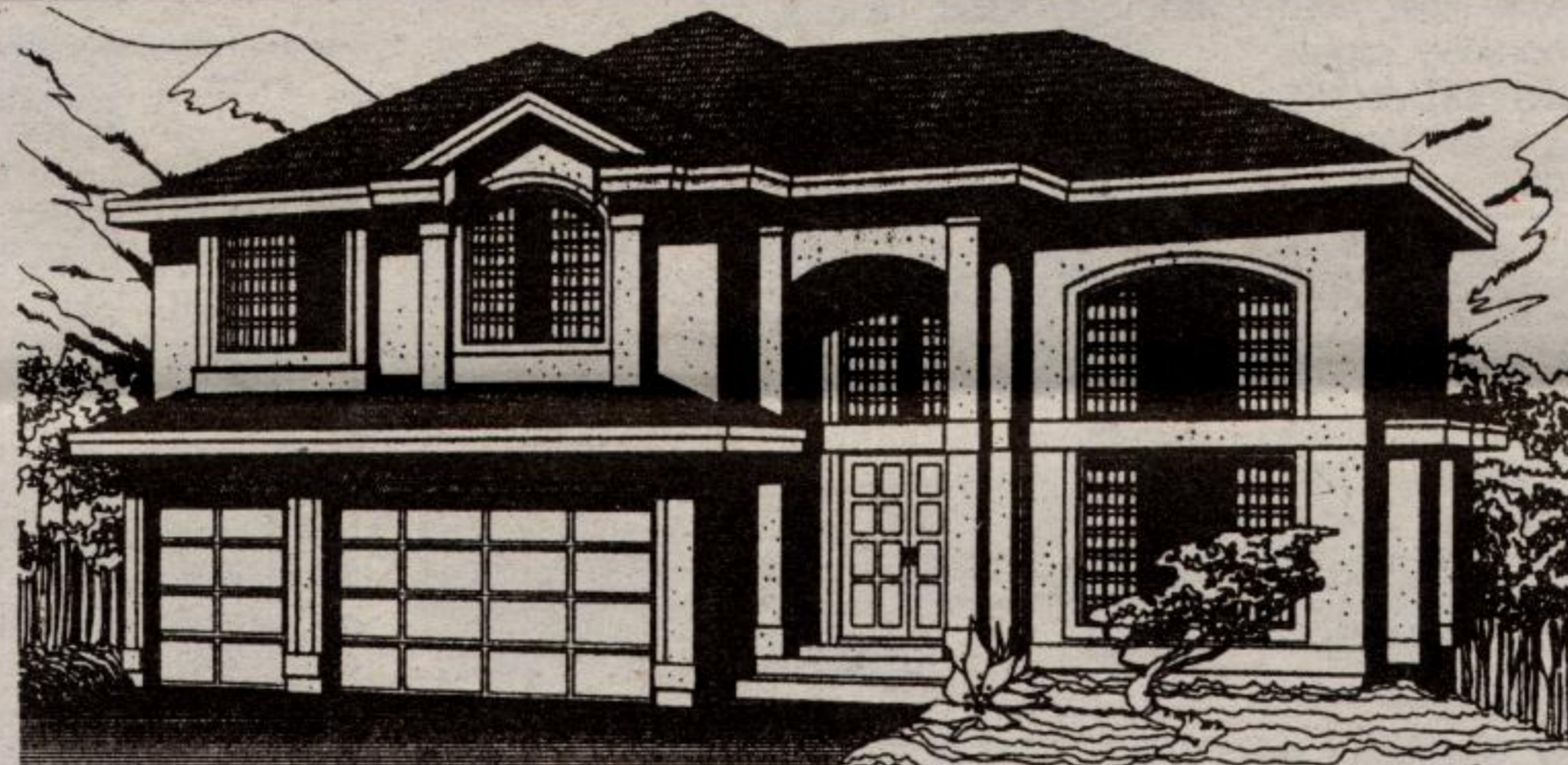

Deluxe family home

At 3,768 square feet, there is no question that this home provides ample space for a large family to live comfortably. There are certain design features, however that enhance this spacious atmosphere, providing an open living environment that is both elegant and practical.

Enter through double doors into a spacious foyer, open to the second storey and brightened by an overhead arched feature window. A sunken living room, also two storeys high, features floor to ceiling windows and a cosy gas fireplace. A half wall provides a subtle division between the living and dining room. A sliding pocket door leads from the dining room into a gourmet kitchen featuring ample cupboard and counter space, a handy work island, and a pantry. The breakfast area receives plenty of natural light from surrounding windows. The family room, open to the kitchen and breakfast area, provides a comfortable area for informal gatherings. The

den, separate from main traffic, would make an ideal study.

A stylish curved staircase leads up to a deluxe bedroom area. The games room could be easily converted to a fifth bedroom if necessary and features a vaulted ceiling and boxed out window seat. Double french doors lead into the master bedroom which features a boxed out sitting area, a walk-in closet, and a five piece ensuite with double sinks, a raised soaker tub, and an oversized shower.
