Music store coming to town

Debbie Feenstra says it's time to bring her Rockwood Musicland business to a new level.

That means more sales, a larger population ... and a move.

So on June 30, the Acton native will move her 21/2 year music business from a strip plaza on Alma Street in Rockwood to the building that formerly housed Leathertown Fashions on Mill Street.

"It was always in the back of my mind to move the business some day and this year I decided it was time," Feenstra, a former employee at Holly Industries, said



Feenstra said she would like to hire someone part-time and a move to a bigger town with a larger target market was the answer.

She anticipates that sales will improve, considering Acton does not presently have a record store, there will be an increase of 4,700 in population and the possibility of young clientele from five Acton schools instead of just Rockwood Centennial.

Feenstra also plans to get involved with the schools, supplying them with band music.

"I'm glad to get going. And I'll be glad to serve more people. But it's hard. It's not like I'm sick of Rockwood," Feenstra explained of the move that will likely see her open in Acton in early August.

"I just know that if sales were better, business would be easier."

It would also allow the Everton resident to hire a part-timer instead of running the store solo six-days-a-week.


While her husband, Oscar, or one of three kids will spare her a few minutes to grab a catnap or run errands, she hasn't enjoyed more than a two-day holiday in almost three years.

"I want holidays so badly," sighed Feenstra, who will have a month's respite before opening in Acton.

"I've already got family outings planned and will probably spend a lot of time at home, but I've told my friends that I've got a date with each of them."

Rockwood Musicland, likely to be known as Acton Musicland, offers customers CD's, cassettes, music videos, T-shirts and caps, guitar and instrument accessories, sheet music and books and musical gifts: mugs, stationery and jewelry.

Though not confirmed, Feenstra hinted that she will probably offer music lessons in the back portion of the 1,000 square-foot Mill Street building.
