Sidewalks are 'a go'

Sidewalks will be installed in the Acton Legion's new subdivision, despite an appeal by a majority of homeowners to not build them.

General Committee members have rejected a request by residents to not install the sidewalks.

Birchway Place homeowner Dennis Gubenco presented councillors with a 29-name petition asking that the sidewalks not be installed and that money be used for something else, possibly a walkway behind the homes.

Gubenco said the people who signed the petition prefer a rural atmosphere that does not include sidewalks. He said people want to be able to park two cars in driveways and don't want to have to shovel sidewalks in the winter.

Town staff noted that the street is not a cul-du-sac, but a crescent and Town standards call for sidewalks. Staff also note that there

is a proposal for a 48-unit seniors building in the subdivision and the sidewalks would be necessary for pedestrian safety.

Councillor Gerald Rennie noted that with only half of the homes occupied in the subdivision there may be an equal number of new owners who do want sidewalks.

Rennie also said that it was unlikely that the lawns would be laid before the sidewalks were installed and that the decision about the sidewalks could not be delayed until the last house was built.

Councillor Norm Elliott was surprised to see the petition.

"I'm deeply puzzled by the approach that I feel is totally wrong," Elliott said.

"The issue is safety and we hear from people wanting sidewalks all the time. I have a great concern that the point of view of the seniors is not here."


