It took the Eramosa Township Fire Department 45 minutes to


extricate one victim, an 84-yearold Eramosa man, from the wreckage. His injuries were serious.



Tory MPP re-elected in landslide

Ted Arnott's promise throughout his recent campaign was that he would do his best to represent the people of Wellington County.

Now, 21,753 local citizens and many others province-wide will be monitoring his and Premierelect Mike Harris's moves carefully, to see if they hold true to their word.

Arnott, who, at 32, is the youngest member of the current P.C. Caucus at Queen's Park, dominated the Wellington polls in Thursday's provincial election, ousting his nearest opponent, Liberal Don Ross (5,741) by more than 16,000 votes.

"We worked very hard until the end of the campaign," reported Arnott on Monday. "We even visited polls and canvassed on election day. We were hopeful, but had no idea (the final outcome) would be that pronounced."

NDP Elaine Rogala was reduced to third-party status with 4,104 votes, while Dr. John

Meenan of the Family Coalition Party and Libertarian Dianne Sanderson had 782 and 268 votes.

"I think people are taking to the Common Sense Revolution. The decisions government is making are similar to those people want government to make," claimed Arnott, who took all 16 Eramosa and Rockwood polls.

"They also want government to live within its means."

An avid reader, tennis player and skier, Arnott said he will press to have the NDP's labour law (Bill 40) repealed as soon as possible.

He admitted that the last five years have been tough, but that he Council to stay on top of local

As co-chair of the Mike Harris task force on creating jobs through small business, coinciding with his duties as small business advocate, Arnott recently met with small business people and organizations throughout Wellington and across Ontario. He discussed the small business sector's contribu-

tion to job creation and the government's role in stimulating growth in small business.

"Small business is an area where I've had a great deal of involvement. I would encourage small businesses to hire," he said.

"If every business in Rockwood hired one person we would not have an employment problem in Rockwood."

As for the other candidates, Rogala says she will likely return to her job as a social services worker with Dufferin County.

Meenan will continue his 30year practice as a family practitioner in Kitchener, while Ross. will work closely with Eramosa returned to farming full-time on Friday.

Sanderson, 48, eyes a return to her three-year position as an officer manager.
