

## Vandals do damage at golf course


Blue Springs Golf Club was the target of some senseless vandalism recently.

Apparently two potential suspects were seen leaving the course on bicycles following the vandalism to landscaping and signs.


Police are investigating.

### Suspect apprehended in London

Back in March, The Tanner reported some complaints to police from Maria Street residents.

The apartment residents called police after a man, posing as a repairman, attempted to gain entry into their units.

A few weeks later, police issued a warning to seniors in particular, about giving bank I.D. numbers over the phone to individuals claiming to be bank officials.

Staff Sergeant Ron Welsh, of the Halton Police, revealed Monday that the suspect had been apprehended in London, Ont., on June 17.

Welsh said there were over 100 complaints from across southern Ontario in the past two years, related to the same man.

Apparently the man would gain entry to apartment units by posing as a repairman working for the superintendent. He would then steal purses, wallets and credit cards. Some time later he would call his victims, this time posing as a bank official, in order to learn their personal identification numbers to their bank accounts.

The suspect is charged with breaking and entering and fraudulent use of credit cards.

### Man charged with impaired

A '89 Chrysler Daytona was observed, at 2 am Sunday, to be weaving and swerving as it drove along Queen Street.

Police stopped the vehicle, applied a breathalyzer test, and charged the driver with impaired driving and over-80.

The 43-year-old Guelph man will appear in court on July 31.

## Careless driving charge

The driver of an '82 Chevrolet suffered minor head injuries and faces a charge of careless driving after a single-car collision at Main Street North and School Lane.

The accident occurred at 10:30 am Saturday. The driver, a 48-year-old Weston, Ontario, man, was treated at Georgetown Memorial and District Hospital for his injuries.

### Minor theft, major headache

Halton Police report that sometime overnight last Monday, a floodlight was stolen from outside the TimBri Tea House. The light has a \$15 value.

And overnight Tuesday, some graffiti was etched in the green and a flower bed was damaged at Blue Springs Golf Course. Damage is estimated at \$100.
