

# Developers not ready to build?

Only one Acton resident showed up at an open house held by the Region on Wednesday at Acton High to unveil multi-million dollar plans to upgrade Acton's wastewater treatment plant.

Staff and consultants at the meeting were not disappointed with the lack of interest — as one said, sewage plants aren't glamorous and there are very few people living near the Third Line facility who would be affected by it.

The public information session was part of the environmental assessment process for the \$2.8 million project that will improve the plant's operations so it can handle a population of 10,000.

Benson Leung, Halton's man-

ager of special projects, said the Region is currently going through the pre-design phase of the project. The next step is for the Acton developers to agree to pay their share of the upgrade costs.

"I'm surprised that I haven't had too many calls from the Acton developers saying they want to be ready to build in next year's construction schedule," Leung said.

"I thought that after the Ontario Municipal Board approval for the new housing, they would be lined up, waiting for approval. But it looks like they are happy with draft approval for now and might just sit for a while."

"From our perspective we can't let them sit. We need them to come

to the table and negotiate the formula to pay for the upgrades," Leung explained.


