Peloso moves chiropractic clinic to town

It is said that eight out of every 10 people will suffer some type of back pain in their lifetime. Dr. Tim Peloso feels every Rockwood resident should be visiting him for a check-up just like they frequent their family doctor or dentist.

Peloso, 33, recently moved his five-year chiropractic practice from Guelph to the village, opening the Rockwood Family Chiropractic on Alma Street across from Petty Bros. Garage.

"I'm an advocate that everyone should get some spinal maintenance care," says Peloso, who earned degrees from both the University of Guelph (Bachelor of Science) and Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (Doctor of Chiropractic) in Toronto.

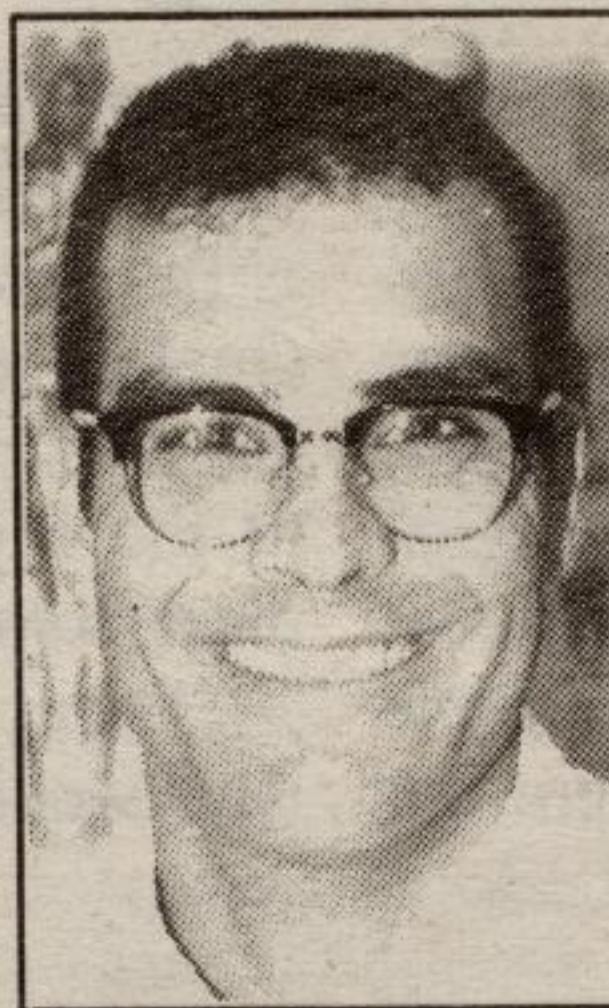
Peloso actually has lived in Rockwood for the past four years. Tired of driving to Guelph daily, he decided to not renew his lease.

"People are finding their way

here from Guelph and I'm meeting lots of new people," he says of the transition. "With any new venture it takes time, so I'll be patient."

Yet the Guelph native has been aggressive in getting his face known in the community. He's joined the Rockwood Eramosa Business Association (RE-BA) and is looking forward to helping them attract small business to town. Peloso hinted that he's in the process of establishing a bike trail around the Conservation Area.

After the University of Guelph where he majored in applied human biology from 1979 to 1983 and the Chiropractic College, the single Peloso was stationed in the town of Clinton.

After his two years of doing a locum (providing services from someone on a sabbatical or long-term vacation), he returned to the area to start his own practice.

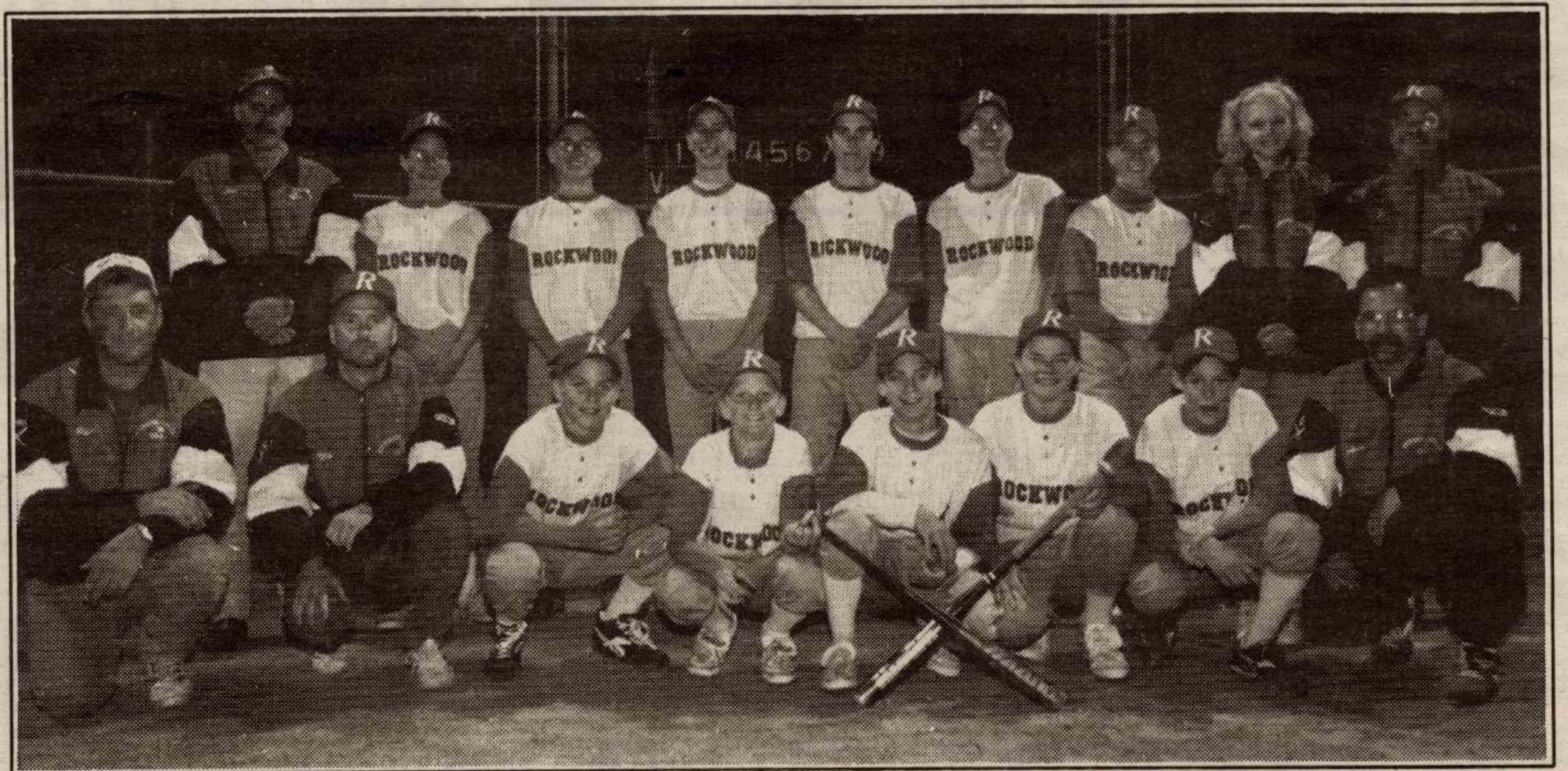

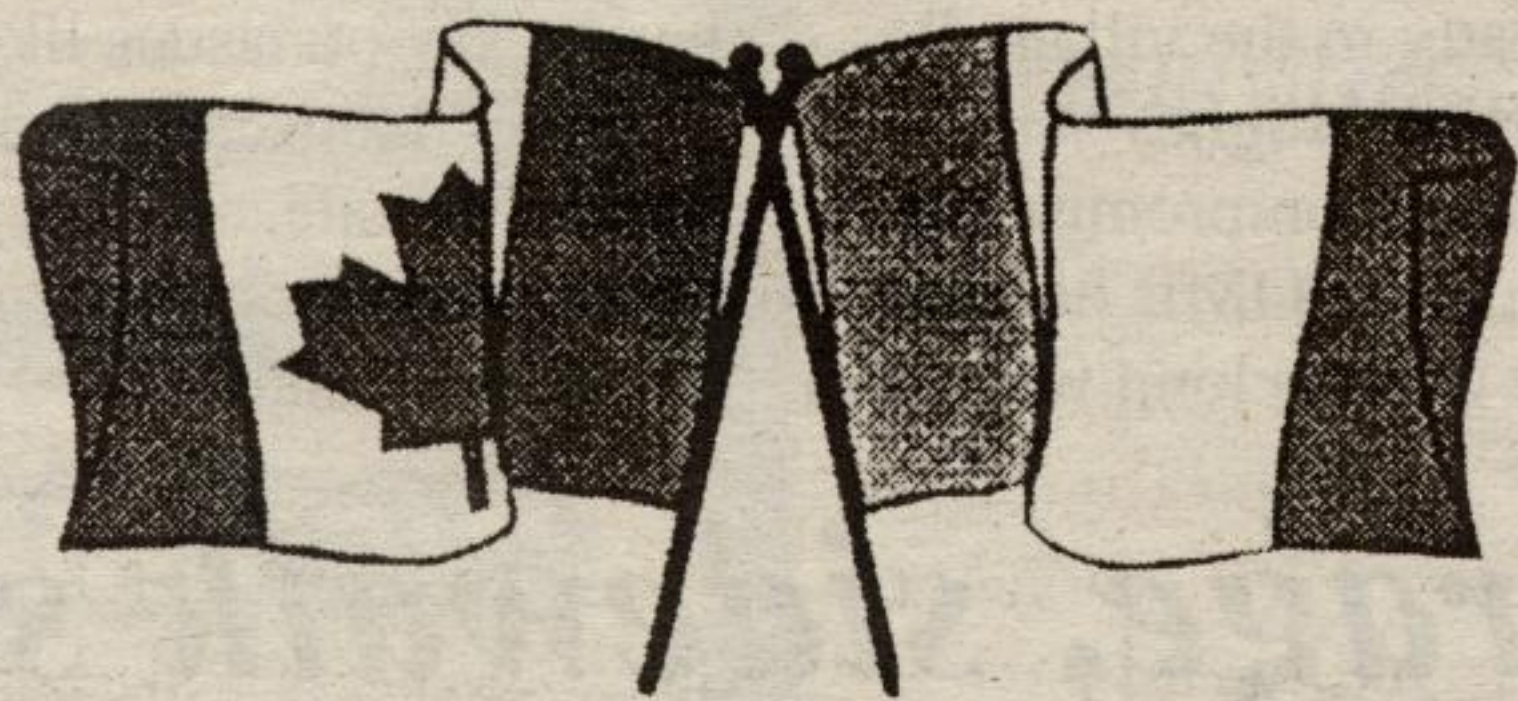
