



New legislation applauded

Halton-Peel MP Julian Reed last week applauded "some badly-needed legislation" which recently passed into law.

Reed said he approved of "an urgent bill to do with selfintoxication or the defence of extreme drunkenness. Defendants now will be prohibited from claiming that they were too drunk to know what they were doing."

The MP also commented on the new DNA testing bill, which recently received Royal Assent. The law will give police the right to forceably obtain a DNA sample, providing that there is enough evidence to justify issuing a warrant.

Reed said that "DNA should be as common as fingerprinting. It is certainly more reliable and has the ability to protect the innocent as well as convict the guilty."

More theft, vandalism

Three incidents of vandalism and theft were reported by police over the past week.

Residents of a duplex on Mill Street East returned home Sunday to find the glass door and frame of their home broken. The vandalism occurred sometime between Friday and Sunday and damage is estimated at \$200.

The tenant of a Young Street apartment reported the theft of a Zenith television and remote control, between 2:30 and 6:30 pm last Friday. The set is valued at \$1,000.
