Owner will clean up 'eyesore'

The overgrown weeds, litter and broken glass should be cleaned up from the former Canadiana restaurant site by today (Wednesday).

Town staff imposed the cleanup deadline on the property owner following recent complaints from Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette that the site was an eyesore and a possible hazard.

Town by-law enforcement officer Ron Stein said that property owner Vince Cavallo agreed to remove some tree branches and garbage that had been illegally dumped on the site at Queen Street at Acton Boulevard.

"The owner also agreed to secure an open door, clean up some broken glass and cut some over grown vegetation," Stein ex-

plained on Wednesday.

"There is a large, locked garbage container on the lot and it looks like somebody just dumped some bags of garbage when they couldn't get into the container. The owner is a bit of a victim himself."

Cavallo reported that his site plan application for the property is on hold because Halton Region said it could not comment on the plan for a 4,800 square foot commercial plaza until the issue of a water allocation for the property was settled.

In an interview on Thursday, Cavallo said that initially he was told by Regional staff that he had an inherent right to water since the previous restaurant on the land had a water allocation.

"It's a funny situation because now Halton said my plan is premature when I originally was told that my plan was infilling," Cavallo

Cavallo said he will demolish the existing building once building permits are issued for the new building, which will include two professional offices, a fast food outlet and general retail space.

Election spending

Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette spent \$2,597 in his successful bid for re-election for his Ward 1 Regional seat.

The mandatory financial statements for the November municipal election show that Bonnette also received \$700 in campaign contributions while his challenger, Jean Hilborn, received and spent \$2,372 in her bid to unseat Bonnette.

The statements also show that both Acton Councillors Norm Elliott and Gerald Rennie had campaign contributions of less than \$100 and expenses of less than \$2,000 and were not required to file detailed accounts.

Two mayoralty candidates — Bob Malcolmson and Mike Armstrong—have not filed the required statements and if they don't do so before Aug. 13, they could be ineligible to hold office up to, and including, the next regular election.
