Green Thumb Gardening

Euonymus

Euonymus are a large group of plants classified as broad-leaved evergreens, meaning they have leaves which they retain yearround as evergreens do their needles. During harsh winters they may lose some foliage, but grow more in the spring. They are attractive and interesting plants, partly because of varying habits (shrubs, vines, low hedges, mass plantings and ground covers) but also for colourful, glossy foliage. Euonymus do not tolerate wet locations but require no other special soil conditions and respond well to pruning in midsummer. Emerald Gaiety's deep green

silver-edged leaves, at their best in full sun or partial shade, acquire a pinkish hue in winter. At maturity it grows 3' to 5'. Emerald Gold & Gold Tip, similar in character and appearance (green and yellow foliage), differ in that Gold Tip's larger leaves are more subtle in colour. Sun Spot with yellow and green leaves is a lower growing variety

prominent in full sun. Coloratus, a vigorous ground cover, whose deep green leaves turn purple in the fall and winter, grows 1' high and spreads approximately 3'.

Sarcovie and Bigleaf Wintercreeper have glossy green foliage. Bigleaf has orange-red berries in the fall and grows up walls.
