DOWNTOWN ACTON, THIS SUNDAY, AUG. 13 (11 AM TO 5 PM)

More music, merchants for 4th annual Festival

Good food, good music, good times in downtown Acton.

That's the motto of this year's fourth annual Leathertown Festival, slated for Sunday, Aug. 13.

"Things are shaping up very well," reported organizer Janis Fread yesterday (Tuesday). "We're very pleased with the response we've had, and it looks like we'll be able to fill up the whole street with Mill Street residents' displays, businesses, vendors and entertainment."

Fread said that there were over two dozen craft vendors coming to town for the event, along with "over a dozen merchants, and over a dozen community groups as well."

Just a few highlights planned for Sunday: Trinity United Church members will be selling homemade pie and beverages under their shade trees along Mill Street, Centre Ice Sports Cards will host an all-day POG tourney, Andy's Restaurant will feature an outdoor patio, both the IGA and Foodland plan farmers' markets and the Acton Fall Fair Board will be selling their famous candy floss.

Also, service clubs like Rotary and the Optimists will be setting up their ever-popular food booths.

Fread said that, for the first time ever, the Festival will feature professional entertainers.

"We were able to afford

the professionals because of our four generous sponsors - Superior Glove Works, Eagle Ottawa Canada, Four Directions Native Art & Craft Gallery and Watkins Nutrition & Health Care Products.

"But don't forget about our regular local entertainers, like Cheri Lindsay's Dancers, the Star Thru square dancers and the County Cabin Cloggers," warned Fread.

The IGA's farmers' market and Hoops, Pockets & More's "carpet bowling" will anchor the west end of the Festival, while the east end will be anchored by pony rides and a jumping pillow for children. Also, Wetherby's will host their British Day, with a guest

appearance by Rupert the Bear, who is celebrating his 75th birthday.

In between and all along Mill Street, there will be exhibits and vendors, along with two entertainment areas: the Main Stage in front of the Holland Shop, and the "Second Stage" in front of the Medical Centre.

Again this year, Town

Councillor and B.I.A. executive Gerald Rennie will act as the event's master of ceremonies.

Add in some bake sales, sidewalk sales, craft show, face-painting, leather demonstrations and clowns. It sounds like this year's Festival should be the best yet!

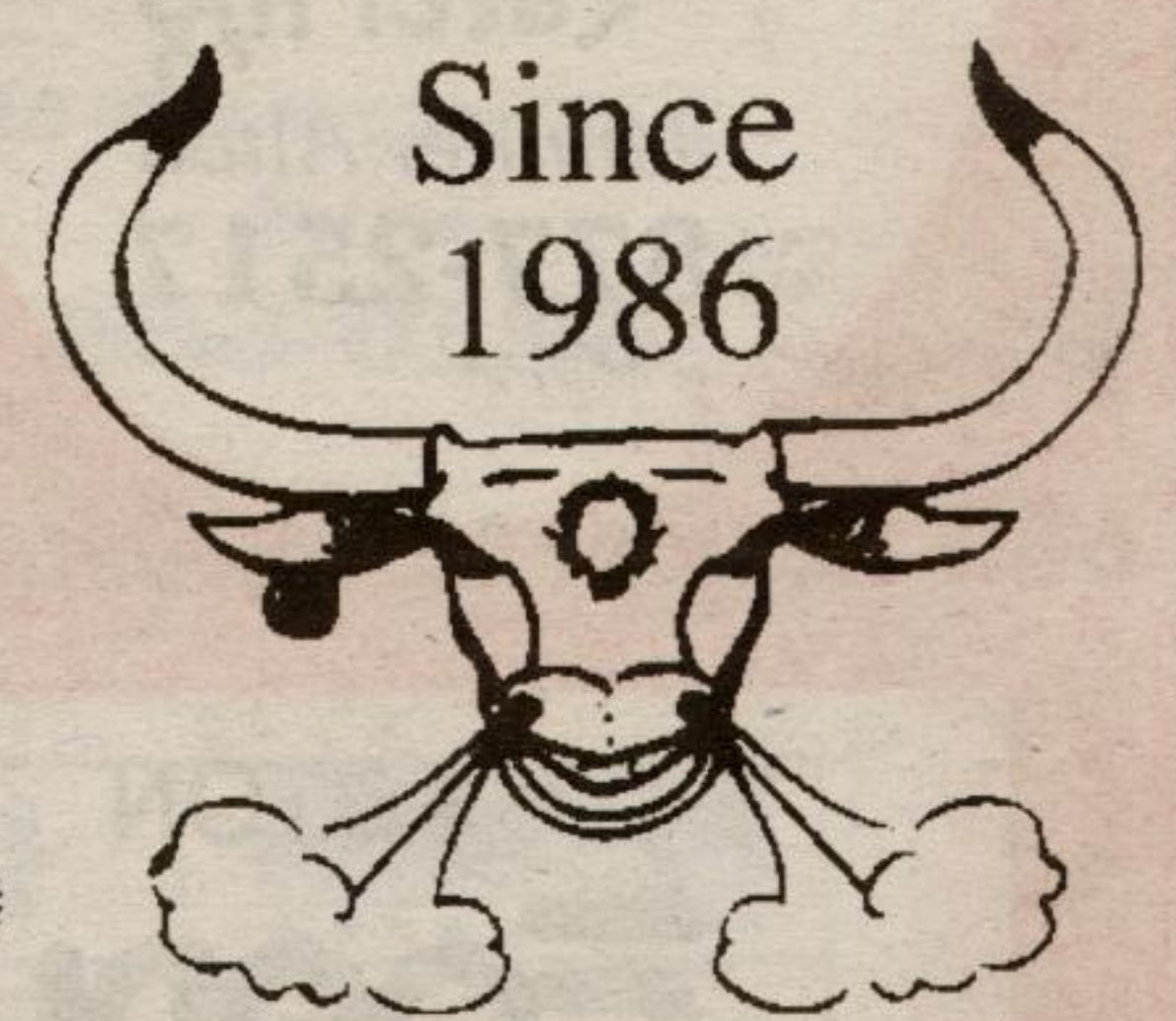
