Construction delayed for Fair

A scheduling change means muchneeded repairs to roads near Prospect Park will not interfere with the 85th edition of the Acton Fall

Fair next month.

Although the proposed water main and sewer replacement and road work was to have begun by now, it was delayed until next week on Lake Avenue and will be wrapped up before the fair.

Following the fair in mid-September, work will begin on Knox Street and Park Avenue.

When Halton Region planned to reconstruct existing waste water mains and water mains on Knox, Park, Lake and River Street, the Town decided to piggyback on the project and install new storm sewers at the same time.

The Town's cost for the project is \$245,862.

Break-in thwarted by couple

Police were called after an alleged assault at Mill Street and Bower Avenue on Sunday at 4am.

A man and woman were walking near the intersection when they observed someone looking into the store window at Entertainment Tonite on Mill Street.

Apparently the young man yelled to the thug, advising him the store was closed. The suspect then approached the couple, shoving the woman. The girl's boyfriend shoved back, and the suspect produced a pipe, striking the man in the leg.

The two victims left the scene, but the suspect followed them to a George Street residence, when he fled on foot.

Police believe the suspect may have been attempting a break-in when his plans were thwarted. They are looking for a 20 to 30-year-old white male, 5' 7" tall and 130 to 140 lbs. He has long dark hair and a mustache and was wearing blue jeans, black gloves and a T-shirt with a Nazareth logo.

Staff at the Red Dog Cafe called police around 9:30 pm after eight patrons, six male and two female, left the Mill Street restaurant.
