

## Park pool reopens

Prospect Park's wading pool is open again after Town staff closed the facility on Monday due to the water's "cloudiness."

"We think the cloudiness was caused by a low chlorine count, so we closed the pool for a day for safety reasons," explained Recreation and Parks Department spokesperson Joanne Wilson.

The popular wading pool will be closed for the season after Sunday's swim. Until then the pool is open daily between 1:30 and 4 in the afternoon.

Wilson expressed "thanks to the Acton Rotary Club, who sponsored August admission fees." Rotary paid \$550 to the Town in order to maintain free admission.

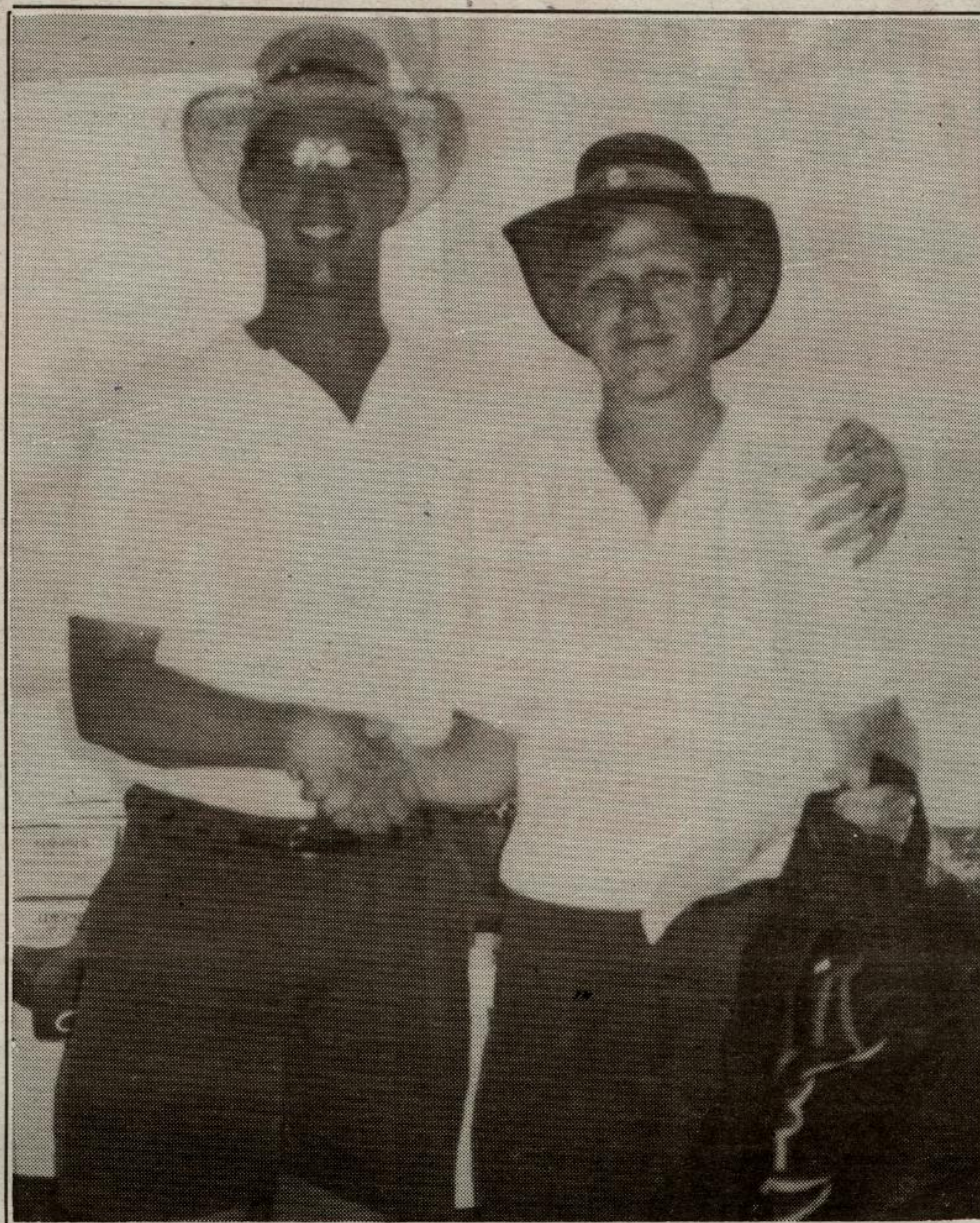

## Driveway search is still on

An Acton couple have until Nov. 8 to shut down their illegal auto parts recycling company on Hwy. 25 south of town.

Town Council gave John and Lori Bruner a three-month extension on the deadline to shut down so the Bruners can continue negotiating with the Ministry of Transport (MTO) concerning a safe entrance onto their land.

When the Town discovered the Bruners were illegally operating the recycling business more than two years ago, they told the couple to apply for rezoning and an Official Plan amendment, which were turned down by Council.

The Bruners are attempting to sell the property to a farm welding business but the MTO has raised concerns with the safety of the driveway entrance to the property.

After several visits to the site, the Town has asked the MTO to report on where it would allow the entrance to be located.

Town planner Alan Binks, who noted that the Bruners have not been paying business taxes on their property, said the application is a classic case of a professional planner versus a politician.

"The professional is just giving the planning advice and the politician is looking at things that have nothing to do with the appropriate land use - they have to do with politics, which means looking good to the public and getting re-elected," Binks said.

Lori Bruner said she can't understand why they are getting such a hard time when Acton needs industry so badly.

"Imagine the frustration of a little guy like me," she said in a recent interview.

"That land was used as a mushroom factory and there wasn't any problem with the driveway. Well, what does it matter if there are mushrooms or car parts in the trucks that use the driveway?"

Bruner said they are liquidating their inventory and have let go two employees as they prepare to close.

The MTO is expected to comment on the driveway situation before the end of the month.
