Vandals hit Hide House

Rural Acton owners of a property on 17 Sideroad returned home at 11:30 pm last Monday to learn their home had been robbed.

Stolen was a TV set, a CD player, several CDs, a laptop personal computer, some jewellery and some loose change. Total value has not yet been determined.

Earlier in the evening, neighours saw an older model, blue panel van in the driveway. Police suspect the thieves made their get-away in the van.

Burning sofa a real hot seat

Firefighters were called to extinguish a fire in a field along Glen Lawson Road (between Acton and Limehouse) last Thursday around 6:30 pm. It seems an old sofa, which had been dumped in the bush, had been set on fire by unknown culprits.

Another incident of discarded furniture and rubbish being set on fire occurred Sunday at 2:17 am. This fire was set in the alley behind Double Pizza on Mill Street.

Firefighters extinguished the blaze in under 30 minutes, but damage was done to a nearby garage, with an estimated \$1,000 price tag.

Ball fan ripped off

A woman, who was watching a minor baseball game behind the schools on Acton Boulevard last week, returned to her car to discover her purse had been stolen. I.D., credit cards and some cash were in the purse.

The incident occurred last Monday between 6:30 and 7:30 pm. Police are investigating.
