Rockwood Squirt Girls are ORSA champions

All season, they were known to their followers as The Never-Die Girls. To the opposition, they were nothing less than a legitimate threat.

And though their play throughout the Tri-County season was proof enough, it was even sweeter on Monday night, as Rockwood disposed of Norwich 24-8 in a game played just south of Woodstock to sweep the best-of-three Ontario Rural Softball Association (ORSA) Division B Lassie (Squirt) championships 2-0.

"They never quit. They came ready to play last night," said Rockwood coach Tom Parkinson yesterday (Tuesday).

"We were just a little better than that particular team.

"When one kid had trouble hitting in a particular game, another came through."

It was that type of effort that helped the same club, save for pick-ups Jodie Culver and Ashley Gates from the other Rockwood Squirt team, finish atop the 11team Tri-County loop with a sparkling 18-2 record.

They advanced to the final in series 2-1. Georgetown against Glen Williams. An August heat wave and

fatigue (six games in two days) played a part in losing the title.

"Glen Williams was very good. We just got beat by a better team," conceded Parkinson, who was assisted on the bench by his brother Paul Parkinson and Al McPhedran.

"But I was certainly proud of the season they had."

So much so that he didn't want the season to end. Having filled the requirements for the ORSA championships, he optimistically dropped Rockwood's entry into the pool of talent.

"At the start of the year I felt we had a good young team, so I thought this would give the kids some experience, whether we won or lost," said the fourth year ball coach.

"To make it this far was just incredible!"

And it was all made possible by a well-balanced attack, highlighted by good pitching and stellar defence.

In Round 1 of the ORSA playdowns-the squad compiled a 6-1 overall record - Rockwood met Norwood (east of Peterborough) in a battle of offences.

The locals took the best-of-three

Culver was a one-lady wrecking crew, smashing two home runs and adding a triple for eight RBIs in her team's 19-11 win in Game 1 of the series.

A doubleheader in Rockwood would decide matters. Rockwood fell 19-16, but rebounded in the rubber match with a convincing 26-14 win.

A trip to Fisherville, just south of Cayuga, began second-round play. Score it 13-12 for Rockwood as pitcher Kelly Wilton was the hero in this one, striking out the last batter with the tying run at second base.

Five days later the series was over following a 15-5 Rockwood verdict at Lloyd Dyer Park.

Lindsay Parkinson was a perfect 4-for-4 at the plate. Gates belted a grand slam and Jessica Osborne collected three hits.

On the mound, Wilton and Jill Parkinson were mesmerizing.

"I'm proud of the kids. It's been fun and the parent support was outstanding," Parkinson praised, adding local businesses funded road trip transportation.
