

During the Branch celebrations in 1976, Comrade Ruth Finley was awarded the Legion service medal for her auxiliary contributions over many years as zone commander.

Comrades Finley, Shultis, Lois Gordon, Joan McKnight and Janet Rogers received their lifetime membership pins at that time.

"We now have nine lifetime members, most of whom are still working hard to keep the new Legion a great place to come to for banquets, weddings, parties, sporting events or just to socialize with old friends," explained Shultis.

It was Sept. 11, 1945 when the Ladies Auxiliary to Branch 197 held its charter night with a surprise venison dinner supplied by the Zone Commander J.M. Mc-Donald and served by the members of the Branch executive.

A catering service was undertaken on a small scale with banquets held in either the YMCA or the St. Alban's Parish Hall, where people enjoyed food that was prepared in members' homes.

In 1957, when the kitchen and auditorium were completed in the old Legion building, the banquets became larger, in terms of turnout:
