# BIA backs off budget request

Faced with almost-certain refusal, managers of the Acton Business Improvement Area (BIA) have withdrawn, for now, their request for Town money to help revitalize Mill Street.

Last month the BIA asked Council to include \$10,000 in the 1997, and \$300,000 in the 1998 capital budget forecast for the engineering work and improvements to the downtown core.

The request was put on hold until Councillor Gerald Rennie, Council's BIA representative, returned from holiday.

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
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Rennie also noted that there is perception among BIAs - and not just in Halton Hills - that councils are abandoning downtown cores because they know the BIA levies will pay for core improvements.

Outside the meeting Rennie said BIA members decided to regroup when they saw their request for cash was "not going to fly."

"If the proposal went down in flames and was rejected we would have a hard time bringing it back," Rennie explained as he said that the BIA will approach the Town's budget committee next year to try to have the project included in a future budget forecast.

#### Green Thumb Gardening

#### Corkscrew Hazel

At this stage of the season most deciduous shrubs and trees have shed their foliage and will remain this way until the spring.

During this time these plants are lacking most of their visual appeal. Their leafless state can be very stark and lifeless, but the reverse is true of the corkscrew hazel; it is most attractive in fall and winter.

Its beauty is found in its unusual branches, which are revealed when its leaves drop. As you may expect from its name, the branches grow with a twisting and curling fashion similar to a corkscrew. This characteristic also makes an interesting ingredient in floral arrangements.

The corkscrew hazel poses few problems to cultivate. It adapts to most soil conditions but performs best in well-drained and fertile soil with a full sun exposure.

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
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
