# More than 500 at weekend art tour

Two years ago, Rockwood artisans Ross and Wendy Durfey stuck a sign outside their village residence to gauge the reaction of people interested in seeing the former's wood works and weaving projects of the latter.

The first car down the road pulled into their driveway.

They both were sold on the idea to begin a Rockwood Studio Tour, demonstrating the wealth of local and luring visitors to the village.

the Rockwood Creative Arts Group, were encouraged by the success in May of their first annual Outdoor Show and Sale, Art on Seven. And they were pleased on the weekend with the Rockwood Fall Studio Tour, the third tour of studios in the area.

At least 500 people visited 10 artisans at their home or workplace to not only see crafts and where they are made, but also to talk with the creators themselves.

Paintings, wood carvings, wrought iron work from 16-yearold artistic blacksmith Mark Banks, wooden toys, weavings, spinnings, pottery and sculpture were just some of the work on display.

drawing; Harold Rice, native wood carvings; and Dorothea Martens.

Ross displayed his wood works, including functional pieces such as a cookbook holder. Wendy showed off woven fabric items and baskets.

"The weather wasn't too bad. It didn't slow anybody down," Ross reported on Monday. "We had at least 500 people through our place and that's fairly representative.

"This time of year we're trying to get people moving around and talent, promoting arts in the area exposure to artists. We would like to have a lot of sales to make them The Durfeys, two founders of money, but we'll see repeat business. People got to meet the artist and got a better appreciation for their work."

And they came from far and wide. Aside from the local interest, many made the trek from Oakville, Hamilton and the Niagara Peninsula, along with couples from Port McMurray and New York.

"We want to limit the tour to 12 locations, keeping it close enough to the heart of the village and also getting a good range of arts and crafts," Ross stresses.
