NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A DEVELOPMENT CHARGES BY-LAW

BY THE CORPORATION OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF HALTON

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Regional Municipality of Halton passed By-law No. 205-95 on the 18th day of October, 1995 under section 4 of the Development Charges Act.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-Law by filing with the Clerk of the Regional Municipality of Halton not later than the 16th day of November, 1995 a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection.

An explanation of the development charges imposed under the By-law, a description of the lands to which the By-law applies and a key map showing the location of the lands to which the By-law applies are set out below. The complete By-law is available for inspection in my office during regular office hours being 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday.

BY-LAW NO. 205-95

A BY-LAW TO AMEND DEVELOPMENT CHARGES BY-LAW NO. 90-94 REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF HALTON

By-law No. 205-95 amends by-law 90-94 relating to development charges on non-residential building expansions and redevelopment. The amendments provide for an enhancement to the expansion exemption from 5,000 square feet to 10,000 square feet or 25% of gross floor area, whichever is greater. In addition, this exemption is available to businesses for each expansion or redevelopment without a time restriction, providing that a building permit has not been granted within the last six months. Accordingly, any business expansion or redevelopment occurring in Halton will not be subject to Regional development charges on the first 10,000 square feet of building expansion.

The Total Specific Urban Charges presented in Schedule A is imposed against all development and redevelopment including certain building expansions within the Urban Area on Map 1 below. The Total Rural Charge presented in Schedule A is imposed against all development and redevelopment not located within the Urban Area shown on Map 1. **The Development Charges Rates in Schedule A have not been effected by the amendments and have been in place since July 1, 1994.**

The amendments do not apply to those lands located within the Milton 401 Industrial Park where the owners have entered into a servicing agreement with the Region but where no subdivision agreement has been signed prior to April 17, 1991. These lands to which the amendments do not apply are identified as Area 1 on Map 2 below.

All charges are expressed in uninflated dollars as at July 1, 1994 and are subject to annual indexing on October 1 of each year commencing in 1996, based on changes to the Statistics Canada Quarterly Construction Price Statistic (catalogue number 62-007).

Additional development charges applicable to specific areas may be imposed pursuant to other by-laws.

(1) Rural areas are subject to urban charges if required to connect to Regional water and/or wastewater services.

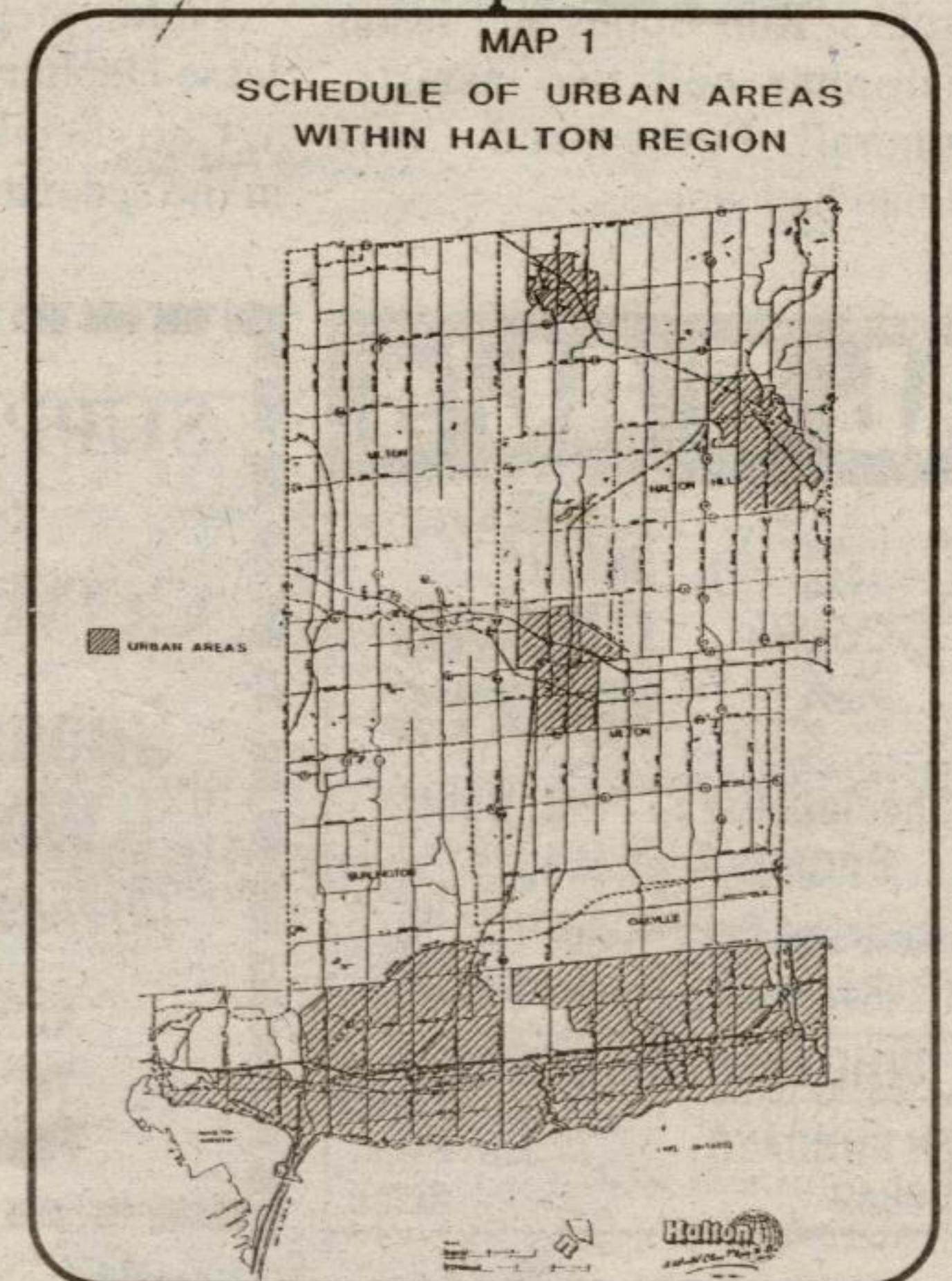

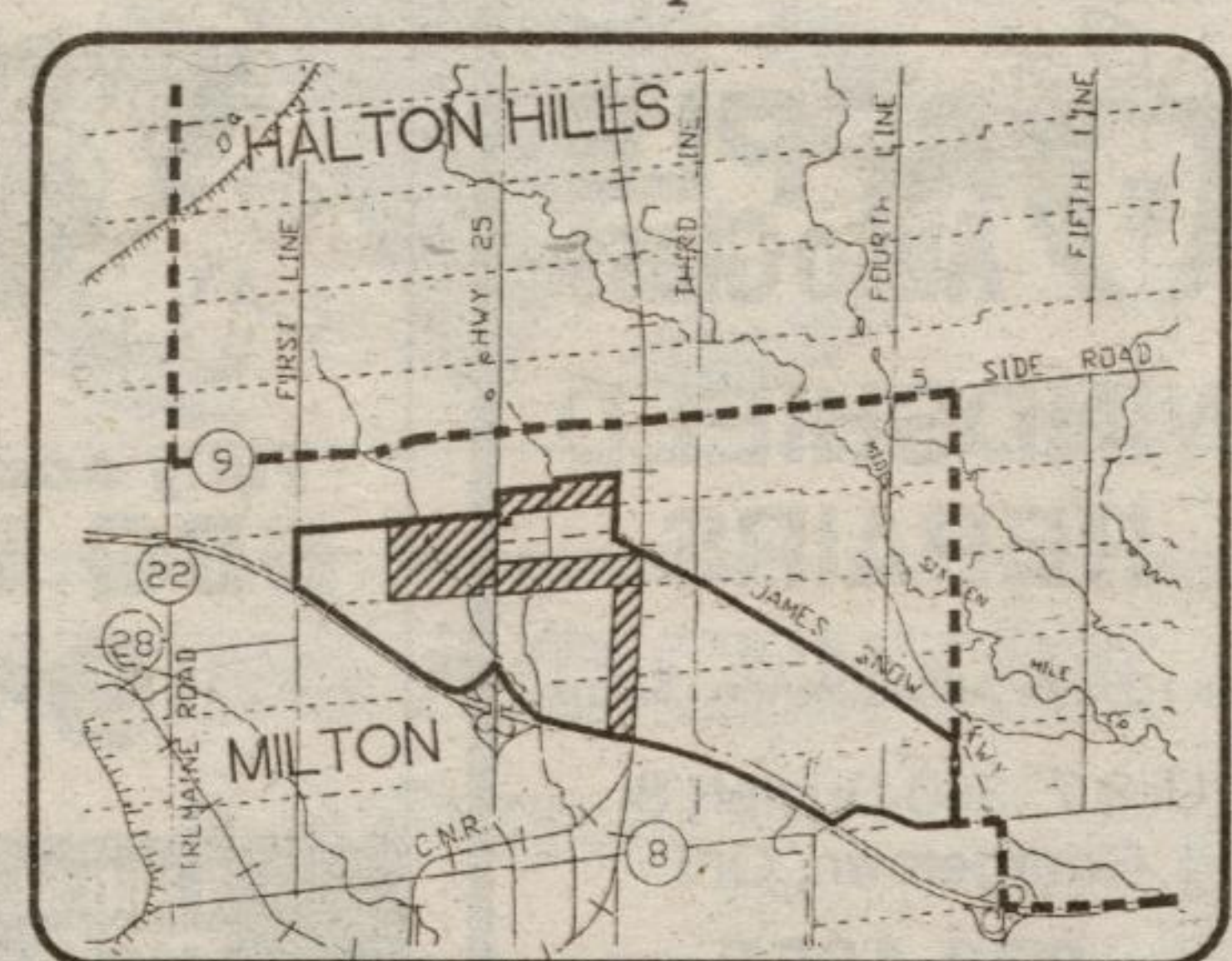
