Staying focussed.

That's what Ken Ellis feels separates his Acton Redmen Junior Boys' volleyball squad from advancing to Round 2 of the Halton high school playdowns against in all likelihood Georgetown and polishing the Air-Jordan's for the basketball season.

It did for three of four regular-season road games (wins at Oakville-Trafalgar, Q.E. Park and White Oaks) in what resulted in a .500 season at 4-4.

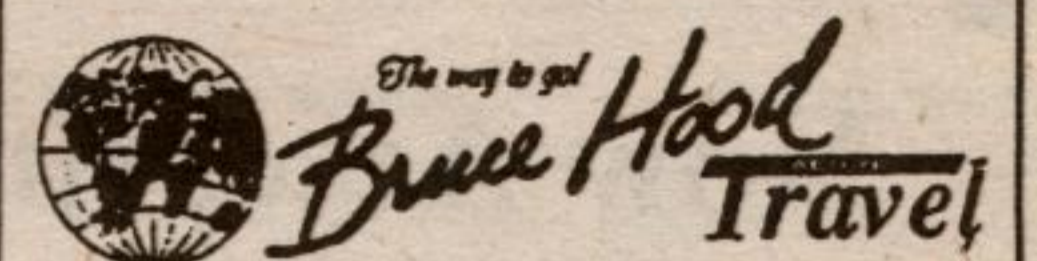
Ellis is preparing his charges for a tough Hawks team, which lost one of its top players to ejection in the opening game of the recent Bishop Reding tourney against the Redmen.

"I think they'll be pumped up, because of that player being red carded and eventually losing that game to us. They're an all-around strong team, but not overpowering," Ellis pointed out.

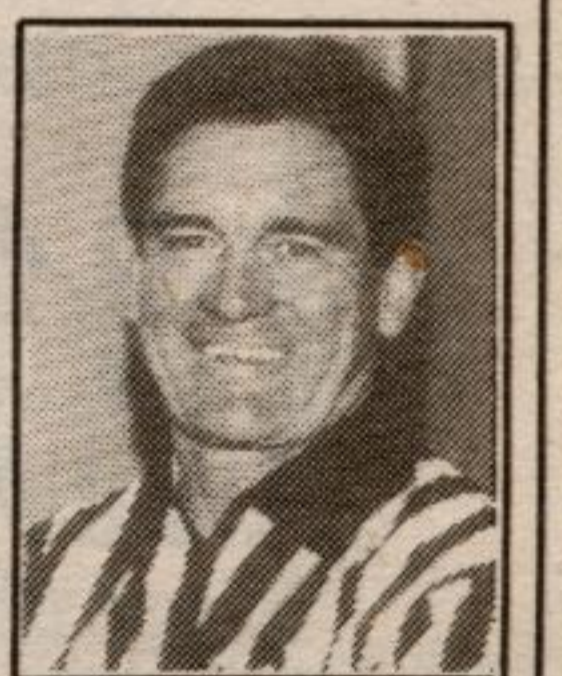

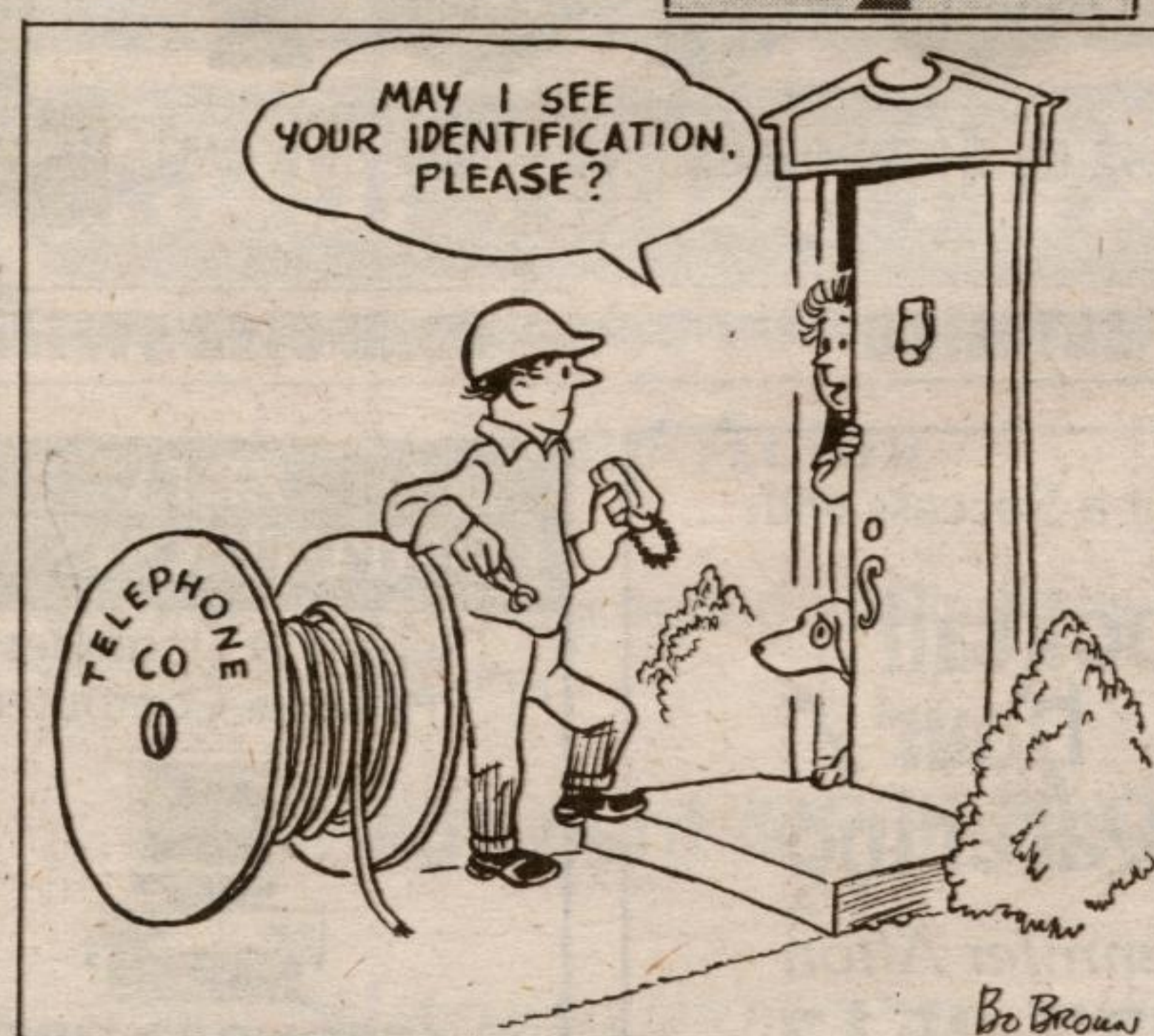

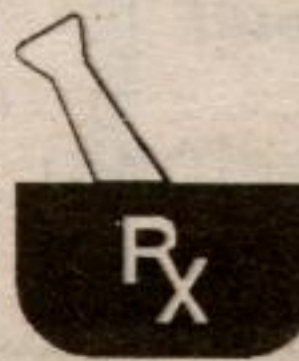
