'Time for Bouchard to leave'

Parti Quebecois Leader Lucien Bouchard will do no favours for Quebec if he chooses to stay on as leader, Julian Reed, Halton-Peel MP, said in a recent press release.

Quebeckers and the rest of Canada are tired of the referendum debate, Reed said. Whatever Bouchard's next move is, it will mean a lot to the future of Quebec.

"Is Bouchard going to position himself to try and spin more of his black magic message to the citizens of Quebec, or will he save Canada and Quebeckers a lot of grief and get out while the getting is good?" asked Reed.

Quebec is also in serious financial difficulties, having the largest per capita debt of any province,

which has worsened since the PQ came into power in Quebec, said Reed. During the last two weeks before the referendum, money was leaving the province at a rate of about \$200 million per day.

Reed pointed out Quebec's financial health influences the Canadian dollar.

"In the end, Quebeckers will not thank a Lucien Bouchard who would take them into the tank."

Fire fighters were again needed at a chimney fire in a house near Fourth Line and Sideroad 25 on Sunday just after midnight. The fire spread to the walls of the house before being put out. No one was hurt and the extent of damages was not reported.


