To all citizens of Acton, Campbellville and Legion members, a special "thank you" for making this year's Remembrance Day celebration the huge success that it was.


Comrade Frank Spielvogel and his crew have been working overtime for the last few months to make this Remembrance Day something the communities would appreciate.

for his help in this.


