GIRLS' V-BALL PREVIEW

One of the Senior Redmen Girls' volleyball team's main goals this Halton high school season is to improve upon a fifth-place standing in the Volpe Division. But coach Bob McKay is just itching to get back to the single-A OFSAA championships.

The signs are there. The fourth-year Redmen coach has kept nearly the whole team intact—eight of 11 players—and a new offence is being introduced.

"In just one week of practice I know that OFSAA experience helped us. There's no comparison from last year, in terms of court presence," McKay enthuses.

On Monday, McKay introduced a 5-1 offence—five attackers, one setter. He's confident the '95 edition of the Redmen are ready for it, considering they were the only squad at OFSAA to play a 4-2.

"We worked so hard on defence last year, so we're going to develop a quicker approach to the game by speeding up the offence," McKay confirms.

He admits the new setup would put pressure on primary setters Jackie Jahn and Jenn McKay, "because I'm going to have them do different kinds of sets."

But he's confident in both players because they possess tremendous speed.

"Jackie has also been impressing with her hitting," says a pleased McKay, "so I'm probably going to have her at two positions (setter and power)."

Also turning the coach's head has been veteran Krista Keir. McKay has elected to position the left-hander on the right side.

"She'll take the pressure off (power) Jenny Goy, who is going to be a marked girl by other teams,"

says McKay.

McKay covets three rookies.

Yvonne Hendry has been slotted for middle duty. McKay calls Lauren Furness his diamond in the rough who will primarily be used

in the backcourt. And Grade 10 Sandra Wray, McKay mentions, could develop into a very good player, "but is raw."

"I don't know if we have any drastic weaknesses."
