We will be ready to pack our Christmas hampers at the old fire hall Dec. 22 and 23. Everyone who has volunteered will be notified as to time.


Lots of good things to make a complete day worthwhile. First, Gladys Davidson is home from hospital and feeling great, although not going very far from home.
