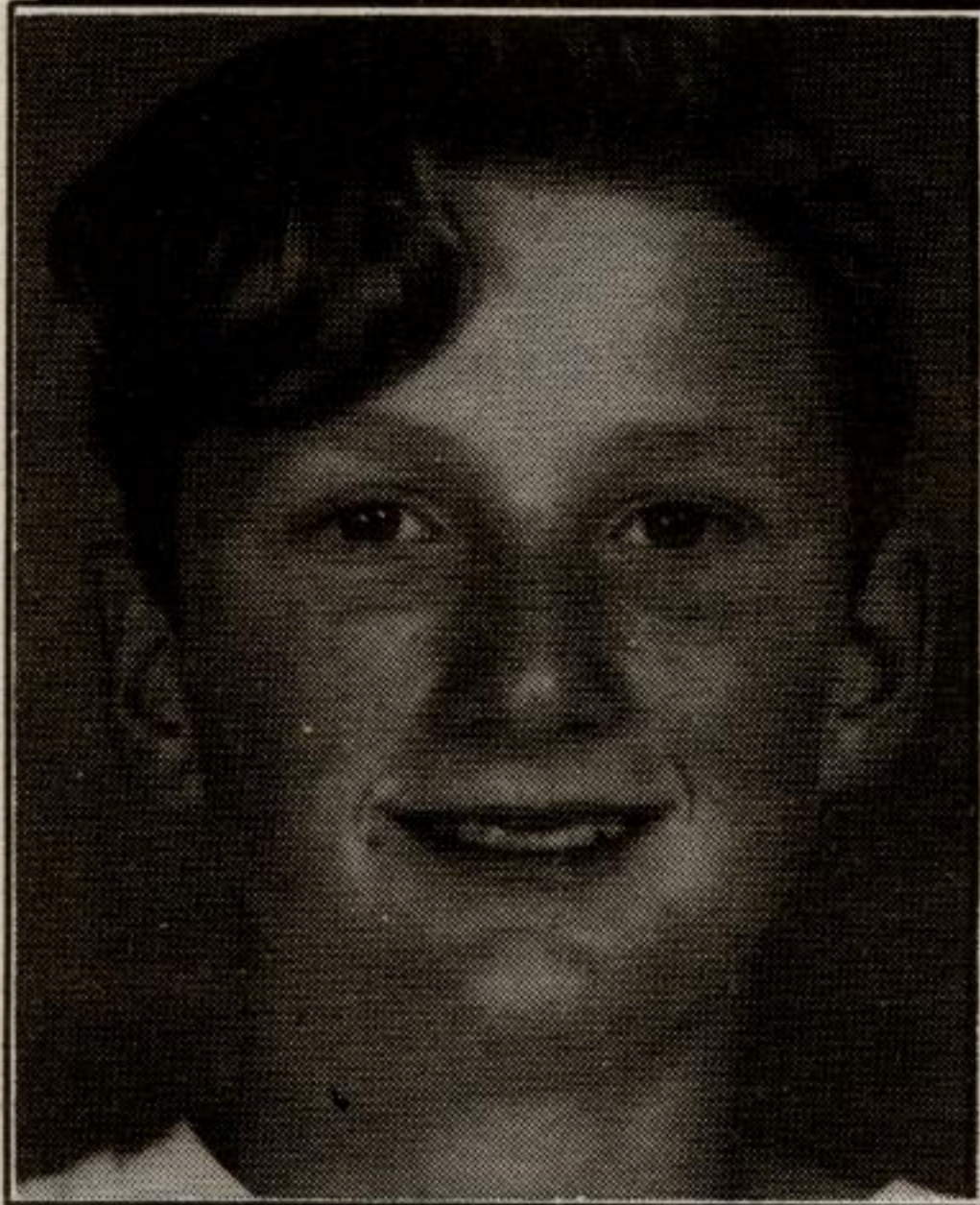


ACTON MINOR HOCKEY REPORT

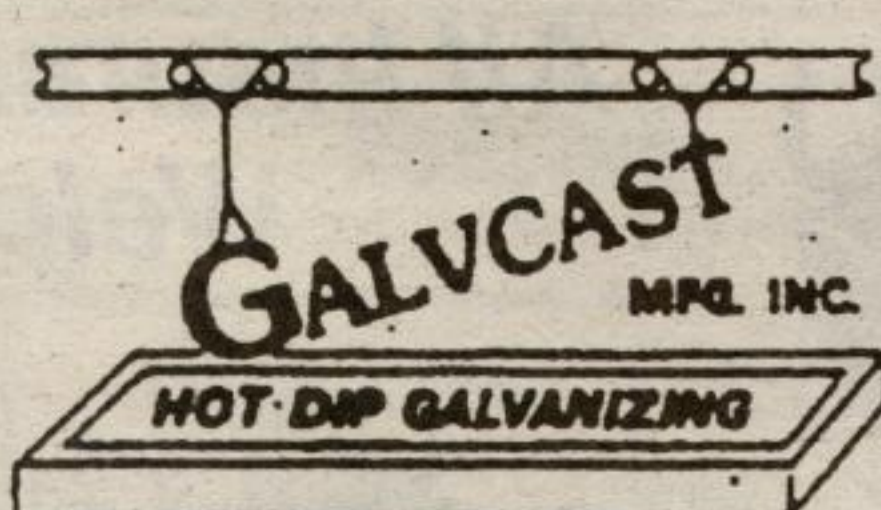
