"I don't think the provincial government of the day is willing to put a final lid on it. I think that there are always maneuvers that

the company can make, like this application to remove the land from NEC control, or an appeal to Cabinet," Elliott said.

The Town has spent more than

\$1 million, most of it in legal fees, to fight the RSI proposal - an amount Elliott said is obscene.

"This puts the Town under tremendous pressure at a time when we are watching every dollar that we spend. It's obscene what we've had to pay to fight this application, which is opposed by everybody except the applicant and its solicitors," Elliott continued.

Last month the Town spent \$10,000 to prepare to fight plans RSI submitted to take Metro Toronto's garbage. The RSI proposal did not make it to the short list being considered.
