OVER 3,000 AT WRITERS' FESTIVAL: Local author and Eden Mills Writers' Festival organizer Leon Rooke figures at least 40 writers entertain a crowd in excess of 3,500 along the friendly banks of the Eramosa River.

ERAMOSA VOLUNTEERS HONOURED: Volunteer efforts by Eramosa residents Diana Wallace and Mike Vogel are recognized by the Ontario Municipal Recreation Association. LOCAL FIGURE SKATER ADVANCES: After near flaw-

less performances, Rockwood's Candice Timbers is two-thirds of the way from competing in the Eastern Canadian Divisional championships in Woodbridge.

ADSETT REACHES 2ND FOR PUBLIC SPEAKING: Marie Adsett, 23, takes second out of 23 participants in the Royal Winter Fair's public speaking competition. Having attended the pre-referendum federalist rally in Montreal, Adsett's point revolved around the possible separation of rural and urban communities.
