## September

**MOFFIT IS FINALIST AT CNE:** Eden Mills' Kimberly Moffit, 12, is one of four finalists in the Solo Vocal category in the annual talent competition at the Canadian National Exhibition. She sang *All I Ask of You*, from the Phantom of the Opera.

**OVER 3,000 AT WRITERS' FESTIVAL:** Local author and Eden Mills Writers' Festival organizer Leon Rooke figures at least 40 writers entertain a crowd in excess of 3,500 along the friendly banks of the Eramosa River.

**ERAMOSA VOLUNTEERS HONORED:** Volunteer efforts by Eramosa residents Diana Wallace and Mike Vogel are recognized by the Ontario Municipal Recreation Association. Diane's volunteer service award honours her 24-year involvement with Brownies and Guides in Eramosa and her work with the Eden Mills Community Centre. Vogel is hon-

oured for his volunteer work with local sports, including baseball.

## October

**LLOYD DYER ASPHALT PLAN GOES TO BUDGET:** Gary Martin, chair of the Eramosa parks, recreation and culture committee, announces a proposal to put an asphalt surface in a section of Lloyd Dyer Park, which will go to budget in the winter.

**SCOUT TROOP GOES CO-ED:** The inclusion of girls into First Rockwood Scouting is met without objection from three people and Scouting executive attending a parent committee meeting.

**NO BREAK FOR LOCAL LAND DEVELOPERS:** Eramosa Council reconfirms its pay-and-play approach by refusing to give two major Rockwood developers - Seaton and Bernardi - development charge credits of \$3,000 per lot in exchange for upgrading the existing sewer and water system.

**WEEKEND ART TOUR:** At least 500 people visit 10 artisans at their homes or workplaces as part

of the Rockwood Fall Studio Tour, the third tour of studios in the area.

**ROCKWOOD'S NEW VET CLINIC' OPENS:** Dr. Clare Maine opens Rockwood's first veterinary clinic, the Rockwood Vet Clinic, on Main Street.

## November

**HARDBALL TO BE AN OPTION AT '96 REGISTRATION:** In an 11-7 vote, Rockwood Eramosa Minor Ball Association executives, coaches and parents vote in favour of Jim Monaghan's motion of offering open registration to youngsters to play either softball or hardball in the T-ball through Peewee age groups.

**OPTIMISTS RENAME EVERTON PARK:** The Optimist Club of Eramosa completes a \$9,500 project that includes equipping the park across from Everton Community Church with picnic tables, a basketball court and new sign. The sign, which reads James G. Lynch Park, is in memory of the Optimist Club's first president.

**LOCAL FIGURE SKATER ADVANCES:** After near flaw-

less performances, Rockwood's Candice Timbers is two-thirds of the way from competing in the Eastern Canadian Divisional championships in Woodbridge.

**ADSETT REACHES 2ND FOR PUBLIC SPEAKING:** Marie Adsett, 23, takes second out of 23 participants in the Royal Winter Fair's public speaking competition. Having attended the pre-referendum federalist rally in Montreal, Adsett's point revolved around the possible separation of rural and urban communities.

**GORDON MAY BE POET OF THE YEAR:** Katherine Gordon is nominated by the International Society of Poets, of which

she's a three-year member, as 1995 Poet of the Year. The International Society of Poets is limited to 1,500 members worldwide.

## December

**GREAT DANE CHAMPS:** Great Dane breeder Scott Johnson has been a success in breeding Great Danes, especially in the last two years, when a litter of 11 produced six champions.

**EDEN HOUSE GOES NATURAL:** Eden House Care Facility co-owner John Boumeester pays \$11,500 to have Union Gas extend their pipeline 1.3 km and convert Eden House from propane.
